The JCCC Foundation Establishes the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund

The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre extends its deepest condolences and heartfelt sympathy to the people of Japan who lost loved ones in the earthquake and tsunami on March 11, 2011.

While events and programming at the JCCC will proceed as planned, our thoughts and prayers are with those in Japan who are suffering. The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre will donate \$100,000 from our upcoming Sakura Ball to Japan Earthquake Relief through our JCCC Foundation. In addition we will be organizing further fund raising events to increase this figure. The JCCC encourages everyone to donate and participate.



JCCC Foundation Japan Earthquake Relief Fund

The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre (JCCC) has created a special, dedicated disaster relief fund within its Foundation to aid the victims of the Tohoku Kanto earthquake in Japan.

100% of funds received in the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund will be directed to the relief and rebuilding effort required in Japan. In the first emergency response phase, funds are being directed to the Japanese Red Cross through the Canadian Red Cross.

In the next phase of recovery and rebuilding, the JCCC Foundation board will consult with the Japanese and the Canadian governments to allocate the Japan Earthquake Relief Funds to effectively rebuild communities in the Tohoku region of Japan.


Please come and support your JCCC!

Anime Day! Bring the whole family! Stormy Night – Arashi No Yoru Ni

The JCCC is proud to present Japanimation for the whole family. Our film is *Arashi no Yoru Ni - Stormy Night*, based on the first in a series of children's books authored by Yūichi Kimura and illustrated by Hiroshi Abe. In 1995, the book won the 42nd Sankei Children's Literature Culture Award and the 26th Kōdansha Literature Culture Award. The film was directed by Gisaburō Sugii and was nominated for Japan Academy Prize for Animation of the Year.



It tells the story of a young goat named Mei who wanders into a barn one night seeking shelter from a storm. In the barn, the goat meets another refugee. The two can neither see nor smell each other, but nevertheless they huddle together fending off the cold, and begin to talk. Eventually they establish a friendship. The two decide to meet later and will recognize each other by using the password "one stormy night."

The next day, when they meet, Mei learns that his companion from the night before was a wolf named Gabu. Although they are natural enemies they decide to pursue their friendship in the face of much resistance for the other goats and wolves and, together, search for an "emerald forest" free from persecution.

The film is moving and funny with an important message on friendship and tolerance. It's a great film for the whole family we hope you'll join on May 1 at 2:00pm for what we hope will be the first of regular family screenings.

Story behind the Song - "Yo Ake Ni Mukatte" (Towards the Dawn)

Since March 11, 2011, my family, friends and I have been praying for the people in Japan, who include my own extended family and close friends. As events progressed, day by day, I began to realize that these events had caused so much damage in Japan that it would take years for the Japanese to recover. I also watched events in other parts of the world begin to take the headline on the news. Already the attention was moving away from Japan, and soon the need for support for the repair and restoration of homes for the 400,000+ displaced people might be forgotten by the world.

Two questions came to my mind: What could be done to connect with those who are grieving the losses of their families and homes? What could be done to ensure that the world and the unaffected parts of Japan would not forget about this disaster and continue to provide support long-term for the restoration of homes and livelihood in places such as Fukushima, Miyagi, Ibaraki, Chiba, lwate etc?

Then, my music colleague and good friend, Hubert Razack, made an wonderful suggestion that we could record a song and donate all the funds to the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund at the JCCC. Initially, we thought of several ideas, such as Sakamoto Kyu's "Ue wo Muite" ("Sukiyaki" in the English version), and the "Circle of Life" from the Lion King musical. As we researched ways to attain the mechanical license to record the songs, a thought popped into my head, "Why not just write your own song?" Immediately, that was followed by, "But I've never written a song in Japanese before." Somehow, my heart overrode my head, and the first line of the song appeared. I quickly wrote it down and everything else came from there. I showed it to Hubert who kindly expressed his enthusiasm for the melody and the lyrics, and, after receiving excellent editing from family and friends (thank you to all of you), he and I went into the studio to record the song - and later to create the music video for it. And that is how "Yo Ake Ni Mukatte" (Towards the Dawn) came to be. We hope that this song will reach the people in Japan, and that it will help all of us to remember to stand by them for the long-term until homes and livelihoods are restored.

All proceeds from the purchase of this song and its karaoko version will go to the "JCCC Foundation Japan Earthquake Relief Fund'.

Yosakoi Group Sakuramai (previously known as Buyaku) was established in 2008. The group is organized by Yurika Hinkle and Emiko Tanaka. Since 2008, the group has been performing throughout the city at events such as Taste of the Danforth, the International Tourism and Travel Show in Montreal, Major League Baseball's Japanese Heritage Night at the Rogers Centre and also at festivals at the JCCC. Its goal is to introduce this unique and exciting Yosakoi dance to Torontonians and hopefully to further promote the Japanese culture.

About YOSAKOI

Yosakoi is a unique style of dance originated in Japan. It is energetic, and combines traditional Japanese dance movements with modern music. The Yosakoi dance usually consist of a large number of people wearing Happi (a kimono like outfit) and dancing with the Naruko (a type of instrument, which was originally used in Kōchi Prefecture to scare birds away from rice fields).

We, the Sedai Committee, collect and preserve the Japanese Canadian history through audio and video recordings in a relaxed interview format. We continue to search for all Japanese Canadians who were born in the pre-war and war years to come and share their stories with us.

The Sedai Project is pleased to report on another successful month. As of February 28, 2011, 88 individuals have assisted us in documenting and preserving the Japanese Canadian history by sharing their stories with us in a Sedai interview. We would like to extend our heartfelt thank you to Susan Hidaka, Byron Tanaka, Bob and Shirley Takagi, Tats and Kim Sakauye, and George Nakamura for allowing us to preserve their unique stories.

Many individuals have been inquiring about the information collected and documented for the Sedai Project. Where were you born/where did you grow up and what do you remember about those years? What do you remember about the Japanese community before the war years? Remember, every story and life experience is unique to each individual and every story is important to our cultural heritage. A picture is often said to represent a thousand words. Reminisce through photographs and documents to help refresh your memory and don't forget to share what you find with your family!

The Sedai Project's current goal is to complete over 100 interviews before the end of April 2011. We would like to ask those who have a story to please help us reach our goal and preserve the Japanese Canadian history for our future generations. We are doing as well as can be expected (I think?) post-surgery. Once again we thank you, and humbly accept the assistance and your thoughts conveyed through it.



『夜明けに向かって』 〜歌に託された想い〜

エミコ・シュエンより

2011年3月11日以来、私は家族や友人とともに、日本に暮らす親戚や親しい友人をはじめ日本中の人達のために祈り続けている。日々悪化していく現実を見るにつけ、今回の大惨事が日本に与えたダメージはあまりにも甚大であり、復興までにはとても長い歳月を必要とすることに私は気づきはじめていた。そんな中、世界の別の場所で起きている出来事が、次第に日々のニュースの見出しを奪いはじめ、早くも世界の注目は日本から離れつつあった。家を失い避難所生活を強いられている40万を超す人達への支援の必要性は、このままではあっさりと世界から忘れられてしまうかもしれない。

2つの疑問が浮かび上がった。家や家族を失い悲しみに打ちひしがれる人々と通じ合える方法はないか。日本や世界の人々が決してこの悲劇を忘れることなく、今後長期に渡って被災地復興への支援を実行し続けていくには、どうしたらいいのか。

そんな折、音楽仲間であり良き友人でもあるヒューバート ラザッ ク氏より、曲をレコーディングし、その収益を日本地震救済基金に寄 付したらどうか?という素晴らしいアイディアをいただいた。当初は、 坂本九の「上を向いて歩こう」(英語バージョンはSUKIYAKI) や、ライ オンキングの「生命の環」(Circle of Life) などが候補に挙がっていた のだが、これらの曲を録音するのに必要な楽曲使用権取得について リサーチを進めていくうちに、ある1つのアイディアが浮かんだ。「オリ ジナルの曲を作ったらどうだろう?」この突然のヒラメキは「でも日本 語で曲を書いたことなんてないし・・」という極めて理性的な判断によ ってあっさりと打ち消されそうになったが、どいういうわけか、すでに 頭より心が先に動き出していたのであろう。曲の出だし部分がどこか らともなく溢れてきたのだ。これを書き留め終えたころには、もう曲は 大方出来上がっていた。さっそくそれをヒューバートに披露すると、 彼もメロディや歌詞を大変気に入ってくれた様子だった。その後家 族や友人のおかげで無事に編集作業を終え(この場を借りて・・・みん な、その節はありがとう) ヒューバートと私は、曲の録音のためスタジ オへと足を運んだ。(のちにミュージックビデオ制作のためにもう一 度出向くことになる)こうして「夜明けに向かって」が誕生した。この歌 が、日本の人々の心に届くことを願うと同時に、被災者への長期的支 援という私達に託された使命を認識するきっかけとなってくれること を願ってやまない。


