JCCC Foundation and the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund

We would like to update you on the JCCC Foundation and its recent activities. The Foundation was created in 2006 with the proceeds from the sale of 123 Wynford Dr. The Foundation was our promise to the Issei and Nisei generations that we would preserve the value of the original centre to help sustain the JCCC for decades to come. Today the fund has reached \$3 million and we hope to reach our \$10 million Foundation goal, the level that we need in order to generate sufficient investment income each year for the Foundation to be a key contributor to our operating plan.

The JCCC Foundation has its own board of directors and an investment committee to oversee the management of the funds. The funds are invested by a pension money management firm named Fiera Sceptre Inc. Fiera Sceptre, the board and the



investment committee are all governed by our conservative investment policy which was updated and approved by the board in February of this year. The investment committee closely monitors the management of the fund through quarterly performance updates from Fiera Sceptre, which also keeps them on their toes. This disciplined process will preserve capital and assure our donors that their money is prudently invested for the future.

Every year the Centre aims to breakeven through programming, rentals, leasing and your generous donations. The JCCC Foundation is an important vehicle to preserve capital and invest for the future of the Centre.

In March, immediately following the earthquake and tsunami in Japan, the board of directors voted to create a segregated fund within the JCCC Foundation, the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund. The goal in establishing this fund was to accept and collate donations and then distribute those funds in the most efficient and effective way to assist the people of Japan in their hour of need.

To date, we have been overwhelmed by the generosity and support shown by our community, friends and neighbouring community associations through contributions to the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund. Donations are now approaching and expected to exceed an amazing \$1 million. While the number of donors are so numerous that we are unable to list them all, we wish to express our deep gratitude to everyone who has generously contributed to the fund.

A wonderful example of how these tragic events have elicited warm and generous care and support from all walks of life is a letter received by the Consulate General of Japan in Toronto. The letter is from a young high school student in Toronto, who was enroute to Japan on March 11 for a once-in-a-lifetime school trip. As a result of the earthquake, Emily's plane was diverted and she ultimately returned to Toronto. While she was disappointed to have missed the opportunity to see Japan, she has very generously donated the money that she had saved for souveniers and gifts in Japan to the Japan Earthquake Relief Fund. We are truly moved by her warmth and generosity. Thank you, Emily.

Proceeds from this screening go to the JCCC Foundation's Japan Earthquake Relief Fund.


Ganbaro Japan! We are all with you

JCCC Origami Crane Project



Since the devastating day in Japan on March 11, 2011, the JCCC and the community have been tirelessly working on projects and events in hopes to support Japan at this crucial time of need. The JCCC Origami Crane Project has been established to create a connection

between the Toronto District Schools and the Toronto Catholic District Schools with students in Japan. In hope to provide emotional support, the JCCC and the District schools have come together to fold the traditional Origami Cranes Senbazuru and write hope letters.

The Japanese word, "origami" is a combination of two words in Japanese: "ori" which means "to fold" and "kami" which means "paper". It is believed that Japanese origami began in the 6th century and because of the high costs of paper, origami was only used for religious ceremonial purposes.

In Japan, the crane is a mystical creature and is believed to live for a thousand years. As a result, in the Japanese, Chinese and Korean culture, the crane represents good fortune and longevity. The Japanese refer to the crane as the "bird of happiness". The wings of the crane were believed to carry souls up to paradise. Mothers who pray for the protection of the crane's wings for their children will recite the prayer:

"O flock of heavenly cranes cover my child with your wings."

Traditionally, it was believed that if one folded 1000 origami cranes, ones wish would come true. It has also become a symbol of hope and healing during challenging times. As a result, it has become popular to fold 1000 cranes (in Japanese, called "Senbazuru"). The cranes are strung together on a string – usually 25 strings of 40 cranes – and often given as gifts.

A famous story about Senbazuru is that of Sadako Sasaki ("Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes"). Sadako was a little girl who was exposed to radiation as an infant when the atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima. Although she survived the bomb, she was diagnosed with leukemia by the age of 12. She decided to fold 1000 cranes, hoping that her wish to live would come true. Unfortunately, she only was able to fold 644 cranes before she passed away. Her classmates then continued to fold cranes in her honour and she was buried with a wreath of 1000 cranes to honour her dream. There is now a statue of Sadako in Hiroshima Peace Park – a little girl standing with her hand outstretched, holding a paper crane. Every year, thousands of wreaths of Senbazuru are draped over her statue.

With just over 120 schools participating in this Project (so far) scattered across Toronto and the GTA we hope that many Senbazuru can be made from now until the end of the school year. The JCCC has already received several thousand completed cranes. We welcome volunteers to join us in this project as there is much preparation needed to complete the Senbazuru. The Sedai Project is committed to collecting, documenting, preserving and sharing the history of the Japanese Canadians. We continue to search for all Japanese Canadians who were born in the pre-war and war years to come and share their stories with us.

We express our sincere thoughts, hopes, and wishes to everyone who have been affected by the devastating occurrences in Japan. These events demonstrate how important family, friends, community, and history really are to a culture; this is the foundation of the Sedai project. We are deeply saddened for those who lost loved ones, friends, homes, and communities. We send our best wishes to everyone.

The Sedai Project is pleased to report on another successful month. As of March 31, 2011, 95 individuals have assisted us in documenting and preserving the Japanese Canadian history by sharing their stories with us in a Sedai interview. We would like to extend our heartfelt thank you to Dr. Arnold Arai, Margaret Adamson, Thomas and Shizue Matsui, Nori and Blanche Kanashiro, and Tomi Kadonaga for allowing us to preserve their unique stories.

Here are a few more questions to help you continue to develop and compose your story. Did you have a nickname when you were growing up? What was your favourite activity/sport/hobby? Did you create any games, or make any toys? What are some activities/ sports/hobbies that you remember seeing or doing when you were growing up, that you don't see the younger generations doing today? Remember, every story and life experience is unique to each individual and every story is important to our cultural heritage. Reminisce through photographs and documents to help refresh your memory and don't dispose of them in the garbage. If you have items, documents and photographs that you no longer wish to keep please donate them to the JCCC Heritage. It is important for us to keep track of Heritage items so we ask that you please fill out a Donation Agreement Form.

The Sedai Project's current goal is to complete over 100 interviews before the end of April 2011. We would like to ask those who have a story to please help us reach our goal and preserve the Japanese Canadian history for our future generations. 2011 Sakura Ball the Biggest and Best Yet!

The JCCC's Sparking Celebration of Community Raises Over \$200,000 for Japan Earthquake Relief

During his key note speech at the 3rd Annual Sakura Ball, Dr. David Suzuki reflected about his childhood and parents' influence on his life. He spoke passionately about his father's love of nature and his guidance to make complex things simple to understand.

Dr. Suzuki's message to 400 attendees community was to "never forget" the historical and current events in Japan, Canada and in the world. He encouraged everyone to think about the legacy to be left behind, built around learning of the shared experience such as the Earthquake and Tsunami disaster, Hiroshima bombing and Japanese Canadian settlement. He urged the Japanese-Canadian community not to take what we have in Canada for granted such as the right to vote because many people fought hard for this right. With current inter-marriage trends of Japanese-Canadians, appreciating the heritage is critical. Themes of appreciation are centred on trust, tolerance, understanding and acceptance.

"I was moved by Dr Suzuki's reflection of his roots and principles. The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre's mission is to educate and maintain the legacy of the Japanese Culture in Canada. The way we conduct ourselves is with Friendship through Culture." JCCC President, Gary Kawaguchi

Reflecting on his personal life, Dr. David Suzuki shared how the discrimination he experienced during his youth as a Canadian of Japanese descent drove him outdoors and led him to experience and appreciate the beauty of our natural environment.

He cited how we have built cities and created unnatural environments that have separated us from nature. Dr. Suzuki is concerned about the human interaction with technology, leading to new psychological and behavioural stress. In order to reconnect with nature and our environment, Dr. Suzuki gave a simple message, urging parents to take their children outdoors. Today's youth have spent more time indoors than any generation that has come before them. By letting children experience the wonder of nature for themselves, we will begin to see ourselves as a part of nature and work towards creating sustainable ways to live.

On behalf of the JCCC, Dr. Suzuki was presented with the prestigious Sakura Award, recognizing his exceptional contributions to the promotion and exchange of Japanese culture and enhancing awareness of Japanese Canadian heritage within Canada and abroad. Fittingly, he was also presented with Noriko Maeda's Shodo depicting the characters 'shi-zen' meaning 'nature'. The varying brush strokes used in the drawing illustrated that nature can be quiet and beautiful, but it can also be strong and powerful.

Entertainment was provided by Nagata Shachu and Steven Page. Our charming Emcee was again CBC's Mary Ito.

The Sakura Ball is the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre's major capital campaign to retire some debt, however this year the priority switched to support the relief and rebuilding effort in Japan. Through the generosity of ball attendees and sponsors \$200,000 was contributed to the JCCC Foundation "Japan Earthquake Relief Fund" - double the initial commitment.



Nikkei Kids Day 2011 Report

The 2011 edition of the JCCC Heritage Committee's popular Nikkei Kids was held on March 14. Over 200 people came out to take part in a large range of exciting activities. This year Mika Fukuma, Lisa Uyeda, Megan Marubashi, Mickey Matsubayashi and Laiko Matsubayashi brought together their creative minds to organize a truly unforgettable March Break event that received overwhelmingly positive feedback from parents, volunteers, and all those who attended.

The theme this year was "kites." Related activities included: making an easy-to-fly origami kite, decorating a personal kite for display purposes, and having a memorial photo taken in front of a large painting of a traditional Japanese kite.

Gloria Sumiya once again provided her expertise for the Japanese-Canadian history section (in the Gallery space), and children were able to experience one of two B.C. interior "ghost town" school activities (during WWII): decorating rocks to be used as paperweights, and making book covers. In addition, children were able to try out their skills with two chores that children living in the B.C. wartime family detention camps were responsible for at home: sweeping, and gardening.

This year the Heritage Court was packed with seven Kenjinkai information tables, which included the Iwate Kenjinkai, Fukuoka Kenjinkai, Kumamoto Kenjinkai, Miyazaki Kenjinkai, Tottori Kenjinkai, Hokkaido Dojinkai, and new this year, the Okinawa Kenjinkai. Three students from Maeda-sensei's shodo class, Yasuko Shimura, Yukiko Yabuta, and Kenzaburo Date, volunteered their time to write children's names in Japanese at the calligraphy workstation.

A special thank you goes out to Ron Inouye for making karinto treats that were handed out to the children who completed all the activities, and to the Japanese traditional drumming group Yakudo, for getting children acquainted with taiko drumming.

私の想い

東日本大震災の映像を毎日見ながらインタビュー、編集と苦しい1ヶ月が過ぎた頃、私はドキュメンタリー・フィルムを作ろうと決めた。日本総領 事館JETプログラムで英語のアシスタントとして宮城県名取市、福島県福島市に滞在し、今回の大震災を心配した両親の懇願で一旦カナダに引き 上げたものの、日本に戻った若者3人の責任感と勇気、思いやりに私の心が大きく動いた。オンタリオ州議会での記者会見で「子供たちのことを忘 れないでほしい。彼らのことを記録に残してください。」と目頭を熱くして言った石川薫大使。無念の思いで死んでいった親。帰らぬ親を待つ子供 たちのことを考えると胸が痛む。

「人間は自分勝手な生き物だと思ったけど、今回はそうではなかった」と東京から戻った友人の須藤栞さん。行方不明の5人の家族を案じる 気持ちを抱えながら、精一杯義捐金集めの活動に専念するモガール和子さんは「犠牲者たちは私たちのネガティブエネルギーを浄化してくれた のだと思う。 そう思わなと悲惨すぎる。」

と言った。オーストリアの高校生から預かった義捐金36万円を持って気仙沼に入り、避難所10か所に洗濯機を寄付した浄土宗の僧侶、「気」の指 圧師・遠藤喨及氏は「相互の助け合いの精神が息づく『環境大国』」として生まれ変わったら、日本は世界で一番豊かな国になるだろう」と言い、気 仙沼でボランティアとして指圧治療を行っている。彼らの思いやりと勇気ある行動、言葉が私の心を奮い立たせた。

正直なところ、危険と思われる場所に行って撮影などする気はなかった。 しかし、人間の温かさ、強さに触れ、「やるしかない!」という気持ちに変わっていった。放射線を体いっぱい浴びた被爆者たちは言う。「あわてる な。私たち被爆者でも生きているんだから!」だから、この程度の放射能汚染など怖くない。やるべきことをせずに人生が終わってしまう方がもっと 怖い。

ドキュメンタリー・フィルム制作目的は一人でも多くの方々に被災地の様子と被災者について知ってもらうこと。この災害がなかったら東北 地方の方々、彼らを取り巻く人々の素晴らしい人間性はここまで表面化しなかった?

今回はOMNI テレビのドキュメンタリー・ファンドを利用しないことにした。著作権の関係で数年間は全く自由が与えられないファンドはかえって邪魔になる。

ですから、どうかカンパをお願いします!少額でも1000人の人たちに協力をしていただければ何とかなります!大困難に直面しながらも、希 望を捨てずに忍耐強く生きる人間の生き様を描くために、5月末、私は被災地に行きます。


