Special Sunday Afternoon Screening: My Darling is a Foreigner

Light Comedy Looks at the Challenge of Marrying Across Cultures



Based on Saori Oguri's best-selling manga sensation in Japan, *My Darling is a Foreigner* tells the quirky story of a Japanese girl who meets and falls in love with an American guy. Saori (Mao Inoue) is an aspiring manga

artist while Tony (Jonathan Sherr) is a language nerd obsessed with the Japanese language.

The couple tentatively pursue their courtship, which is fraught with hilarious miscues, differing expectations and misunderstandings of each other's culture. Can international romances such as this have a happy ending?

You might expect the film to focus on questions of racial prejudice and/or acceptance, but really the focus is more on Mars/ Venus type discrepancies (i.e. His idea of washing the dishes doesn't quite jibe with hers). In fact much of the humor relies on things that real couples living together would have faced, regardless of their ethnic origin. That said, there are numerous explorations of cultural differences, as evidenced through light-hearted interviews of real-life interracial couples. In one amusing segment, a wife complains of her foreigner husband giving her chrysanthemums for their anniversary. In Japan, chrysanthemums are funeral flowers.

This 2010 film was directed by Kazuaki Ue. The screening will be followed by a panel discussion on international marriages between Japanese and non-Japanese. Everyone is welcome. Those in mixed relations will particularly enjoy the humorous insights into "kokusai kekkon"

June Movie Night: GOEMON

Tale of the "Japanese Robin Hood" is spectacular mix of martial arts and special effects

In 2009 director Kazuaki Kiriya brought the tale Goemon to life in this thrilling combination of fantasy, anime action, and folklore. In Japan, Goemon the Good is a folk hero similar to Robin Hood in the West, he was a shinobi, or ninja, who stole from the rich and gave to the poor. Now, in this new film, entitled simply, Goemon, he is brought to life again in a special effects-driven martial arts spectacular.



It is the feudal period in Japan and Goemon (Yôsuke Eguchi) has

FREE! 34th JC Community Picnic on Canada Day at Caledon Place



Coming this September: A Fools Life

In September 2011, Ahuri Theatre will team up with the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre to present a new play entitled A Fool's Life. This original multi-disciplinary theatre piece is based on the life and short stories of modern Japanese author Ryunosuke Akutagawa, one of the most celebrated modern Japanese writers, and best known as the author of Rashomon.



The play tells the story of Akutagawa's feverish mental deterioration in the last few days before he committed suicide in 1927. While attending a wedding in Tokyo, Akutagawa receives news of his brother-in-aw's suicide. What follows is a feverish mental break down caused by his struggles in balancing his artistic passions with his obligations to his family. As he descends further into his mania, the world of his writing intrudes on reality manifesting itself with terrifying results.

This presentation uses aspects of Japanese forms of Noh (dance) and Butoh (mime), three different languages, shadow puppetry and projections on a set made entirely of paper. It also uses live music provided by Japanese Kagura drummer Gaishi Ishizaka, and features Japanese actress Haruna Kondo. It was developed with the support of the Toronto Arts Council, Ontario Arts Council, Canada Council for the Arts (through the Japan Fund). An earlier draft of the piece was presented at the Japan Foundation of Toronto. Please look for details in the next issue of the newsletter.



JCCC Origami Crane Project

The JCCC Origami Crane Project is a way of letting children in Japan know that Canadian students are thinking of them by sending Origami Cranes, 'Senbazuru' and Hope Letters. With the official support from the Toronto District School Board and the Toronto Catholic District School Board, JCCC volunteers have been assisting in teaching the students how to fold Origami Cranes which began in March 2011. The project continues to develop and over 130 schools have participated so far with approximately 60.000 folded cranes!

Since the devastating day in Japan on March 11, 2011, four Senbazuru (4,000 cranes) have been delivered to the students and individuals within the relocation centres in Northern Japan. Our sincere thank you goes to Koko Kikuchi and Yuki Nakamura for making space in their luggage and for delivering the Senbazuru and Hope Letters. Thousands of cranes have been placed in the JCCC display case until they are ready to be prepared as Senbazuru for Japan. In the meantime, we hope that you will visit the display case and participate in the 'Guess the Number of Cranes Contest' where all the proceeds will go towards the JCCC Foundation – Japan Earthquake Relief Fund. The contest will begin June 2011 and will run until the end of August so make sure you submit your guess!

With just over 130 schools participating in this Project (so far) scattered across Toronto and the GTA we hope that many Senbazuru can be sent over to provide support to the individuals in Japan. We welcome volunteers to join us in this project as there is much preparation needed to complete the Senbazuru. A short list from the nominees will be announced August 1, 2011 and the awards will be presented on November 7, 2011 at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto.

Financial Report and Balance Sheet March 2011

The JCCC Board of Directors has a Finance Committee that works with the Board, the Executive Director and committees to prepare an annual budget to ensure that the JCCC is financially stable and provides a framework and guidelines for decison making on capital expenditures, fundraising and operations for each year. This budget is a break even for operations and the JCCC depends on a capital campaign for any major improvements or maintenance to the building. The JCCC Board reviews the budget as part of the financial statements at the monthly Board meetings. Our year end is March 31st and along with our auditors, the Finance Committee and Manager of Accounting and General Administration Kathy Tazumi, the year end Financial Statements are prepared and approved by the Board and the general membership at the Annual General Meeting in June (this year June 27/11).

As part of our Strategic initatives, the JCCC Board of Directors is committed to achieving financial stability in order to deliver on our programming and events. The financial reporting is an integral component of our strategic discussions at the Board level.
