Tai Chi and Meditation Classes

Come and refresh and yourself through Tai Chi and Meditation.

This autumn series, held twice per month, is designed to facilitate participants to experience increased calm, relaxation and revitalization of the body, clarity of mind & heart, and expansion of the spirit. Beginners and masters alike, from age 11 and up, are welcome.

There will be 3 parts to every session:

Part 1: Experience of chi-flow through gentle taiji movements. Through the experience of chi-flow, a person's inner circulation is improved and the number of units of energy at his/her disposal is increased. This results in increased vitality, improved overall health, emotional and mental clarity and simple enjoyment for life.

Part 2: Be facilitated into the meditative experience of wuji, the experience of stillness, inner peace, spiritual expansion and joy.

Part 3: A short talk on energy will be given so that participants will have an idea of how to incorporate energy management into daily life.

Please note that the meditation and taiji taught by Sifu Emiko are non-denominational. It is important to wear loose clothing and comfortable shoes to class. Note-taking or recording of the class for personal use is permitted.

Mizuhiki Workshop

Mizuhiki is Japanese traditional twine art, which has a history that can be traced back 1400 years to the Asuka period in Japan, when envoys from China brought gifts wrapped with red and white twine. It was introduced by the imperial court and developed in a unique way as



part of Japan's culture of gift-giving and gift-wrapping.

While Mizuhiki has traditionally been used to enclose Japanese traditional envelopes (Noshi), it is now used not only for celebrations, weddings, and condolences, but also for greeting cards, jewelry, and home décor items.

At the workshop, two kinds of Mizuhiki flower will be made.

Her aim is to communicate with people around the world by exploring modern forms of Mizuhiki while also preserving the beauty of its history.

Speaker Series: Tom and Kaz Nishio

Two members of one of Canada's foremost family of Nisei, Tom and Kaz Nishio, will be guests at the Speaker Series session on **Saturday October 22, 2011** at 1:00pm in the JCCC Heritage Lounge.

Tomitaro "Tom", 90 and Kazuyasu "Kaz", 85, are best known for their business partnership with Mikasa, the American-based chinaware empire that was founded after World War II by Nisei George Aratani. Brother Norikazu, 88, a retired dentist, lives in Nanaimo, BC. Itsushi, the eldest brother, passed away in Japan and sister Reiko Nakashima in Montreal.

The children of Hama and Ippei Nishio, their father immigrated to Vancouver in 1913 and settled in Kitsilano, where he was a successful silk merchant. His family in Iwamura-cho, Gifu-ken had a silk worm farm. Before World War II, Ippei was the owner of Import and Domestic Silks at 543 Granville St. He was a wholesaler of textiles with business all across Canada.

Tom was a star rugby player for the University of British Columbia right until the last day before his family was removed from the coast. The family was in a 'self supporting' camp at Bridge River, B.C. Tom transferred to Western University in London, Ontario, where he was the first Japanese Canadian student to ever attend that school. While still an undergraduate, the Canadian government permitted Nisei to join the army; he signed up immediately "as a way to prove my loyalty to Canada". Tom served in London, England and Assam, India with a group of Nisei as a translator, before returning to Western University to complete his Bachelor of Commerce degree in 1947.

After graduating from Westmount High, Kaz and his father started Import & Domestic Trading Co. of Canada Ltd. in 1947. The company later became the exclusive Canadian distributor of Mikasa's tabletop products in Canada.

Their first office, after being 'relocated' after the war, was in a St. Catherines Street rooming house in Montreal. Kaz recalls, "I used to walk from door to door to make sales. If I sold it, I packed it and delivered it too!"

On Being Michiko - a Sansei Artist's Journey


From October 6 – November 6, 2011, JCCC Gallery. Everyone is invited to the Opening Reception: Sunday October 16 at 2:00pm. The following is a statement by Lillian Michiko Blakey.

"Who am I? Being not wholly Canadian and yet not entirely Japanese, the nature of my identity has been a troubling issue. On the one hand, I inherited the strong feelings of shame that Japanese Canadians experienced following the repressive actions of the Canadian government in World War II. On the other hand, the fact is that my family members have been loyal Canadians for over 100 years and we had nothing to be ashamed of. Nevertheless, I grew up denying my cultural roots, my first language and my people.

It is only in recent years that I have tried to reconcile my dilemma by depicting my family's story in my art work. I have attempted to bring past and present together by including myself, as I am now, looking back at the events which happened so long ago and analysing the effects on succeeding generations.

Alienation and persecution continue to be suffered by people all over the world. As a result, many people have come to Canada seeking a peaceful existence in a just society. I hope that my work serves as a tribute to the courageous people who came before me, and as a visual warning that the persecution suffered by any family can be repeated, even in the most democratic of countries - even in Canada - if we are not vigilant."

Winter Family Festival!!



当時、新移住者、日系三世、日本からの派遣社員を中心に、7つの 野球チームが結成され、日系人野球連盟として、5月から9月までの毎 日曜日グリーンウッド・パークでリーグ戦が行われていました(現在も 数チームがリーグ戦を楽しんでいます)。それまで火の車であった台 所を潤す一法として、当時NHKの人気番組であった紅白歌合戦をそ のままトロント紅白歌合戦としてスタートさせましたが、日系社会に 全くコネの無かった役員達は噂を頼りに2ヶ月近くを費やし、苦労を 重ねて40名近い歌手に賛同をお願いして漸く開催にこぎつけたこと が昨日のように思い出されます。これが娯楽の少なかったトロント日 系社会で大当たりを取り、野球連盟の会計を黒字にしました。一回の 公演では会場の旧日系文化会館に溢れる観客を収容しきれず、4年 目からは昼夜2回の公演となりました。その後も毎年ショーのスケー ルも大きくなり、野球連盟1団体では運営が難しくなり、1984年に至 り、トロント新移住者協会、日系文化会館、日本商工会、 トロント日系 市民協会の4団体に呼びかけ、チャリティーショーとしてのトロント紅 白歌合戦として引き継がれることになりました。

思い出深い発祥の地旧日系文化会館から現会館の小林ホールに舞台を移して再開してより早や8年、昨年は諸般の事情により開催できませんでしたが、この紅自開催を永続的なイベントにするために情熱をつぎ込んできた、故田中勉さんの遺志を引き継ぎ、来年は開催する方向で紅白コミティーは活動を再開することになりました。しかし再開には日系社会の暖かいご支援とスポンサーや広告主のご援助無くしては出来ません。今後とも愛される「トロント紅白」の維持、発展にお力添えをお願いする次第です。これからもこの紅白が日系人親睦の心温まる機会となることを確信しております。


