The rest of the Board consists of: Ken Fukushima, Anzu Hara, Shari Hosaki, Gary Kawaguchi, Warren Kawaguchi, Sharon Marubashi, Lorene Nagata, Christine Nakamura, Jan Nobuto, Ross Saito (representing Nikkei National Museum and Cultural Centre in Burnaby, BC) and Nao Seko.

The JCCC Board of Directors is diligently planning for the future. Our activities, programs and events continue to grow and we are working to provide the best facilities for our membership and the community at large.

Kats Takada Wood Sculpture Exhbiit until August 30, 2014

Kats Takada's expressive wood carvings of himself and family members are often portraits of alarmingfrankness. They may seem witty and even humorous at first glance, but they're



loaded with stark facts about real-life encounters with physical and mental afflictions, and the poignancy of growing old. "It's coming" is a self-portrait produced when he was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease.

Born in Chigasaki, Japan, Takada immigrated to Canada in 1969.

He had briefly studied the craft of Kamakura-bori in Japan, and resumed carving here by enrolling in evening classes at a community centre. He is a thirty-year member of the Ontario Woodworking Association. The exhibit is currently showing in the JCCC Gallery until August 30, 2014.

EISA - The Rhythm of OKINAWA and the World of Kenji Miyazawa's "A Night on the Galactic Railroad"

Following the success of a spectacular Eisa show performed at the JCCC in summer 2013, Okinawan dance and music performance group Karakoro will be back again on **Sunday August 10, 2014**.

"Eisa" is an Okinawan ceremonial dance which has a history that dates back many centuries. It was originally performed to welcome and console the souls of one's ancestors during the summer "Bon" season. Nowadays, it is performed throughout the year at various festivals and concerts. The performance includes soft feminine dances and dynamic masculine dances with various drums, singing and chanting accompanied by the Sanshin (Okinawan musical instrument that is the precursor of Shamisen), as well as colourful and exotic costumes. Traditional Eisa includes dances with celebratory music along with dragon and lion dances. The non-traditional aspect of this show will start with a Japanese song.

In addition to the traditional and Karakoro original Eisa, this year, Karakoro will bring the world of Kenji Miyazawa with the Eisa version of "A Night on the Galactic Railroad" to the Toronto show. Kenji Miyazawa was an educator, poet, children's literature writer and farmer. He was passionate about the relationship between mankind and nature throughout his life. The main theme of, "A Night on the Galactic Railroad" is pursing the answer to, "What is true happiness?"

Karakoro is a unique performing group consisting of a wide range of people from different age groups and backgrounds. The group has become even more powerful and dynamic since last year. Please come and experience their dynamic Okinawan performance and the world of, "A Night on the Galactic Railroad" at the JCCC this summer!

August Movie Night: LEAVING ON THE 15TH SPRING

A Heart-felt Tale of Growing Up in Okinawa

The film is set on a small island called Minamidaito with a population of 1,200 and no high school. After finishing 9th grade at a school so small they share their cafeteria with primary school children, most of the island's 15-year-olds continue their education on Okinawa. Every year departing girls belonging to a



traditional music circle perform a song titled "Abayoi" ("Goodbye" in the local dialect) for their tight-knit community. The film's heroine is the sweet-but-serious circle leader, Yuna. During an annual sports and culture festival held with a nearby island, Yuna meets a tall, handsome, boy who is the star pitcher of the rival team and they agree to exchange letters. Love begins to bloom across the ocean.

In her stirring portrayal of Yuna, accomplished pop and television star, Ayaka Miyoshi sings and plays the shamisen, a traditional Japanese stringed instrument. Director Yasuhiro Yoshida has worked closely with the locals of Minamidaito to craft a sensitive and poignant impression of a young girl on the cusp of adulthood, torn between the alternately attractive and conflicting natures of tradition and progress.

At the forefront of this trend is Gekidan Shinkansen, one of Japan's most popular contemporary theater companies. Shinkansen founder and director Inoue Hidenori, who calls his style "Inoue Kabuki," has teamed with Kabuki actor Ichikawa Somegoroto to stage a string of hits over the past decade. Grounded in the methods of contemporary theater but incorporating kabuki techniques throughout, these shows pack a real punch with their flamboyant action and rock-concert–like sound. Toronto Japanese Film Festival 2014 – Our Biggest And Best So Far!



June 27 saw the close of the most successful Toronto Japanese Film Festival at the JCCC so far. Ticket revenues increased by 50 percent and audiences were unanimous in their praise of the quality of the line-up. Visiting director Yoshihiro Nakamura called it the best international festival he had ever participated in. It was a great 2 weeks!

Azuma Morisaki's PECOROSS' MOTHER AND HER DAYS won the Grand Jury Prize for Best Film and Grand Jury Prizes were also awarded to Yoshihiro Nakamura's THE SNOW WHITE MURDER CASE and Takashi Miike's THE MOLE SONG – UNDERCOVER AGENT REIJI. Takashi Yamazaki's THE ETERNAL ZERO received the festival's Kobayashi Audience Choice Award.

The announcements were made at the closing reception of the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre's 3rd annual Toronto Japanese Film Festival following the sold-out North American premiere Yoshihiro Nakamura's THE SNOW WHITE MURDER CASE. Director Nakamura was in attendance to introduce the film and collect his award.

The Grand Prize Jury included director Daihachi Yoshida, winner of last year's Japan Academy Award for Best Film and Best Director for THE KIRISHIMA THING, Japan Times film critic Mark Schilling and leading members of Toronto's film community.

The 2014 festival featured 18 films including North American and/or Canadian premieres of Yoji Yamada's THE LITTLE HOUSE, Yasuo Furuhata's A BOY CALLED H, Kentaro Otani's BLACK BUTLER, Yuzo Asahara's A TALE OF SAMURAI COOKING, Shin Togashi's OSHIN and Daisuke Miura's LOVE'S WHIRLPOOL.

Celebrating the Dedication of the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre



On June 4, 2014, the JCCC

THE JAPANESE CANADIAN LEGACY PROJECT

celebrated the official dedication of the new Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre (MNHC). Along with outgoing Consul General of Japan Eiji Yamamoto, our naming sponsors Raymond and Sachi Moriyama, and JCCC President Gary Kawaguchi, staff and volunteers from the JCCC Archives and Sedai were able to present guests with a glimpse into the JCCC Collection, comprising of approximately 15,000 unique items the JCCC Archives team of volunteers manages, as well as a peek at the over 500+ hours of footage which Sedai has documented, through the 2010 and 2013 recorded conferences and regular interviews.

More recently, Sedai has been assisting Archives volunteers with the cataloguing of items generously donated to the Centre's collection by Sedai interviewees, in an effort to fully flesh their stories with a multi-dimensional, multimedia experience. We hope that the hundreds of photos, documents, and mementos of their youth will continue to fill visitors to the MNHC with wonder and inspiration.

Recently, Sedai was happy to conduct a short heritage themed programme as part of Kamp Kodomo. Campers as young as 6 years old had the chance to learn about the injustice and difficulty of evacuation and relocation in the MNHC. Sedai continues to work with JCCC senior volunteers and former interviewees in building a resource of voices, to assist as first-hand account docents for the new exhibit space.

If you are interested in assisting the JCCC with our everevolving program of educational activities, we invite you to contact us. As always, Sedai searches for first-hand accounts of the difficult years of removal, internment, and post-war rebuilding as we build our video archives. 

JCCC Judo Kai Defends Judo Ontario Hatashita Club Championship

On Wednesday, July 2, the JCCC Kobayashi Hall was the site for the second Judo Ontario Club Championships sponsored by Hatashita International. All clubs in the province were challenged to put together their team comprising of five athletes (three men, two women), with every club being allowed to invite one athlete from another club to be on their team. The JCCC Judo-Kai team was rounded out by 2014 national U21 bronze medalist Megan Peterkin from the Sheffield Judo Club in Stouffville.

Spectators and participants were treated to a fun event that featured exceptional athletes in the region. The four teams competing included Ajax Budokan (Ajax), JCCC Judo-Kai (Toronto), Kawasaki Rendokan Judo Academy (Hamilton) and the Scarborough Dojo (Agincourt), and featured many national champions (including four on the JCCC Judo-Kai team), and international medallists (two on the JCCC team) and Canada's first ever world champion (Jessica Klimkait from Ajax Budokan, 2013 U18 world champion).




