50 Years of Coming to Canada – Panel Event

At the JCCC's Annual General Meeting in June, the JCCC officially welcomed the New Japanese Canadian Association's merger with the JCCC, reborn as the newly formalized New Japanese Canadian Committee (NJCC). At Nostalgia Night, we had an opportunity to honour the forty years of work this organization has been doing to support new Japanese immigrants as they began their life in Canada.

Beginning with the Suizenji Kiyoko Concert, the weekend of November 7 & 8 will be a celebtration of the more than 50 years of the journeys and resilience of postwar Japanese immigrants; Heritage in collaboration with the NJCC are hosting a panel discussion on **Sunday November 8, 2015** at 2:00pm on the evolving experience of Japanese immigrants in Canada.

Participants will have an opportunity to learn how the new immigrant experience has changed over the years and how it has stayed the same. Attendees will hear the stories of what compelled speakers to come to Canada, what personal adjustments they had to make, what helped make Canada their home – or not, and so much more.

All of our families, at some point in time, came to Canada as immigrants. Hearing these stories connects us together and helps us all understand more about each other, as we discover our own unique, identity as Japanese Canadians or Canadians of Japanese heritage.

New JCCC Martial Arts Program: Jodo 杖道 – The Way of the Staff

The JCCC is excited to introduce a new martial arts program – Jodo – the Way of the Staff.

Jodo is practiced worldwide, and has been a part of the All Japan Kendo Federation curriculum since 1968. Jodo activities in Canada are overseen by the Canadian Kendo Federation that also supports Kendo and laido activities.

The *Jo* is a four-foot cylindrical staff. Jodo techniques are designed to defend against the sword. Its spirit is not to injure the opponent but utilize the techniques that demonstrate the true versatility of the weapon. These techniques include: striking, thrusting, blocking, parrying, pinning, and sweeping. Through Jodo, one learns the dexterity of the movement and the development of the mind, body, and spirit.

In this program, participants will learn Jodo in a non-competitive environment using kata-based partner training. The art is suitable for adults and youth. It is also an excellent cross-training opportunity for other martial arts practitioners. Some non-weapons based practitioners often find Jodo as a good entry point to weapons arts.

October Movie Night: THREE SISTERS A charming family comedy-drama set in the summer festival season of Kagoshima



The family run Tora-ya sweet shop is in financial straits; meanwhile, all three daughters in the family are out of luck with love and struggling in their private lives. Second daughter Namie has recently returned home from Tokyo after a failed marriage and is waiting for the divorce papers. When her husband Toru arrives to win her back, it seems he might be the missing link that can help save the family — in more ways than one.

A classic family drama, Three Sisters is beautifully directed by Kiyoshi Sasabe based on a screenplay by Ryuji Mizutani. The Japanese title of the film is "Rokugatsudou no Sanshimai" which literally translates to "three sisters in June's light". However, "Rokugatsudou" actually refers to the annual lantern festival in Kagoshima around which the whole film is set. This 2014 film stars actress Kazue Fukiishi (The Eternal Zero, 13 Assassins, One Missed Call) with Yo Yoshida and Eri Tokunaga (Hula Girls, Haru's Journey) as her two sisters. A touching and

heartwarming story, Three Sisters is a true multi-generational film.

YOU WON'T BELIEVE THE LAST 5 MINUTES!!! A ROMANCE WITH A MAJOR TWIST. CAN YOU KEEP THE SECRET?

Kurumi Unui's novel was a publishing phenomenon when first released in 2004: a mystery romance with a stunning and controversial twist in its final two lines that drove readers back to reread the book with a changed perception. The book was considered un-filmable until director Yukihiko Tsutsumi (Trick, 20th Century Boys) took up the challenge and he successfully delivers a slick crowd-pleasing box-office hit that imaginatively transcends the standard love triangle model.

The film is set in the 1980s and, like the cassette tapes of that decade, is divided into a distinct Sides A and B. Side A takes us to Shizuoka City and introduces Yuki Suzuki – he is awkward, overweight and paralytic with self-doubt. Invited as a filler on a konpa group date he meets the pretty and disarmingly forthright Mayu (Maeda Atsuko). She gives him to nickname Takkun and mentors him on fashion, hair and etiquette. When she presents him with him a pair of trendy Nikes he pledges to get



himself in shape and takes up running. At this point the film flips the tape to Side B and we are presented with a post-makeover and completely transformed Takkun (Matsuda Shota), now fit, confident and handsome.

Takkun is transferred to Tokyo where he soon finds his allegiance to Mayu seriously tested by coworker Miyako (Kimura Fumiko), a sleek, sophisticated and slightly aloof beauty. Takkun is torn between the woman who made him who he is, and the woman his new self wants. Mayu becomes pregnant and Takkun is desperate, emotionally conflicted and shocked by the impulsiveness and cruelty of his actions. But as things progress with Miyako, the wounded Mayu stays very much alive in his thoughts. A late night wrong number tips the balance.

Take Me Out to the... Sakura Gala JCCC to Honour Japanese Canadian Baseball Team, the Asahi, in 2016



The JCCC is pleased to announce the Eighth Annual Sakura Gala, taking place on Saturday April 16, 2016. The Sakura Gala will celebrate the famous Japanese Canadian baseball team, The Asahi. Established in Vancouver in 1914, The Asahi rose to prominence as a major force in the 1930s, winning numerous tournaments and championships throughout North America.

The team was inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003 and the British Columbia Sports Hall of Fame in 2005. In 2015 the JCCC's Toronto Japanese Film Festival screened the Toronto debut of **The Vancouver Asahi**, a fictionalized account of the baseball team.

The Sakura Gala will pay homage to The Asahi and the team's place in Japanese Canadian history. The Asahi baseball team did not have the opportunity to play together again when the Japanese Canadian internment began, yet, in their hearts, they took to the internment camps the spirit of baseball. The game helped break down racial and cultural barriers when former Asahi players assembled baseball teams in the camps, and they soon found themselves playing against RCMP prison guards and locals unfamiliar with Japanese people. Baseball became a common bond and out of this tumultuous time in history, friendships were born and continued for decades. The spirit of The Asahi gave people hope.



The Asahi baseball team will be the 10th Sakura Award recipient. In the spirit of the JCCC's vision, the Sakura Award recognizes exceptional contributions made by individuals to the promotion and exchange of Japanese culture and enhancing awareness of Nikkei heritage within Canada and abroad.

Encore Presentation of Interrogation: Lives and Trials of the Kamloops Kid

After the successful world premiere of Interrogation: Lives and Trials of the Kamloops Kid at this year's Toronto Fringe Festival (July 1–12, 2015), Karri Yano and Evan Mackay (co-writer and director) are delighted to present two encore performances of the production at the JCCC on **Wednesday November 18, 2015**.

"For years I had heard snippets here and there from family members about Kanao Inouye, a.k.a. the Kamloops Kid, the notorious interrogator of Canadian POWs, who, I learned with a little bit of research, was tried first for war crimes as a Japanese interrogator and failing that, was tried for treason against Canada. At the same time, his sister, my grandmother Martha, along with 22,000 other Japanese Canadians were deemed 'enemy aliens' by the Canadian government and forcibly evacuated to internment camps in BC's interior.

戦後新移住者50年の軌跡

日系コミュニティーの皆様、こんにちは。6月から新しく結成された「新日系コミッティー」のメン バーになりました、レイノルズ洋子と申します。 2008年頃より、旧トロント新移

住者協会 (NJCA) の主催するお正月会でボランティアを始めたのがきっかけとなり、気がついた らこれまでに数え切れないほどJCCCに足を運んできていました。日系社会に関わる人々との交 流の輪は縦に横にと自然と広がりましたが、会館はその皆を繋いだ場所として、重要な役割を 果たしてくれたと実感しています。ここは私にとってのアンカーになっていると思います。

私がカナダへ来たのは2003年でしたが、その頃はちょうど国際結婚をした家族が増え始 め、FTFというメーリングリストが発足した頃でした。自分と似た境遇の友人ができ、カナダでの 国際結婚や子育てを経験しながら、教育や仕事など、この12年の中いろいろな人生の変化も経 験してきました。私たちが移住したとき、日系社会はそれまでに先輩たちが築き上げてきた基盤 がありましたので、すでにとても住みやすく安定した社会でした。

しかし今のように和食レストランも豊富だった訳ではなく、この12年でも大きく変化し続け ています。いつカナダに来たか、なぜ来たかによって移住者の経験は全くことなるものと思いま す。自分の日本人としてのアイデンティディーさえ、違ったものに形成されていくと思うのです。 今年から2017年にかけて、移住者の歴史は50周年を迎えようとしています。1950年代からカナ

ダへの戦後の移住が少しずつ始まりました。1966年には、在京カナダ大使館にて査証部が開設 され、翌年にはカナダ移民法の改正があり、本格的に人の移動が始まりました。

その頃の移住者はどのような思いでカナダへ来たのでしょう。また、その後の高度成長期 に移住してきた人たち、90年代に来た人たち、私たちのように2000年代に来た移民や、近年の移民の経験は皆それぞれ違いますが、今こうし て一緒にここで生活しています。移民の歴史といえば、これまでは戦前移民の歴史に焦点が当てられることが多かったかもしれませんが、私た ち戦後移民もすでに生きた歴史になっているんですね!でもどの時代であろうとも何か共通点がある気がします。皆様にとって、それは何だと
