September Movie Night: Miss Hokusai Free September Screening of a New Anime Masterpiece

Keiichi Hara's extraordinary animated film tells the story of O-Ei, the little-known daughter of the famed Ukiyo-e artist Hokusai, creator of some of Japan's most iconic images. An outspoken 23-year-old and the inheritor of both her father's artistic gifts and stubbornness, she shares his home, and serves as his assistant, often completing or redoing works for him. Unsophisticated, naïve, and fearless, she tugs insistently at the bridle of Edo tradition and propriety, showing her gentle side only when caring for her blind sister O-Nao. Miss Hokusai is mature, unsentimental and startlingly beautiful. Lovers of Japanese traditional culture and anime fans alike will find much to enjoy. Winner of the Satoshi Kon Award for best animated feature film at Montreal's 2015 Fantasia International Film Festival. Voiced by Anne Watanabe and Yutaka Matsushige.

O-Ei's story has also been told in Canadian author Katherine Govier's excellent novel, The Ghost Brush. Ms Govier will introduce the screening with a reading from her novel and a discussion of O-ei's life.

Experience Ukiyo-e



Enjoy this rare opportunity to experience Ukiyo-e, including an overview, carving demonstrations, trying the actual printing process, and the chance to appreciate woodblock print masterpieces.

The carving demonstrations will be done by presentday Ukiyo-e artist, Motoharu Asaka from Japan, who will be demonstrating advanced techniques and skills that are required when carving very thin hairlines.

In addition, there will be approximately 100 Ukiyo-e carved masterpieces by Master Asaka, along with a variety of traditional carving tools and bamboo skins (Baren), which are used to make woodblock prints.

You will also try printing a Ukiyo-e image (your choice of either Kuniyoshi's goldfish or cat images -3 color print) on Japanese paper by using a Baren.

A Q&A will also occur during the event. Don't miss the special event with Master Asaka, the successor of traditional Ukiyo-e which dates back 300 years.

Joy Kogawa's NAOMI'S ROAD – THE OPERA coming to JCCC

Joy Kogawa recently approached me with the idea of mounting a production of Naomi's Road in Toronto. It had been ten years since as a student I had understudied the world premiere of this remarkable show in Vancouver, and was so excited as the prospect of bringing this beautiful show to Ontario for the first time.

This remarkable story is set in Vancouver during the Second World War and tells the story of one Japanese Canadian family among many, who are forced to leave their homes and move to camps in the mountains. One of the most powerful elements of this piece is that it is "Naomi's Road"; that is, it is told from the point of view of the young girl, Naomi. It is a powerful message told through a more gentle voice. Her "road", her journey from life in Vancouver to life far away from home teaches us important lessons about strength and humanity and a child's ability to adapt and grow in any situation.

We live in a time where Japanese-Canadians are fully integrated

and hold an integrated place in the greater Canadians whole... Yet at the same time the fear of the violent and subversive "other", once reserved for Japanese-Canadians, continues to be a part of the North American narrative for other ethnicities and religions. Please join us to remember this powerful story and celebrate its survivors through music and storytelling.

Seventh Kyudo Introductory Course to Begin in November 2016

Kyudo is the Japanese martial art of archery, historically associated with the Samurai. Modern Kyudo is often described as "standing meditation" and focuses on attaining proper technique and attitude rather than hitting the target. This teaches the practitioner to react calmly and resolutely to his environment.

Seikyu Kai is pleased to announce a 15-week Introductory Course to be offered at the JCCC starting in November. Students without prior experience must complete the Introductory Course to be accepted in the regular kyudo program. Students with prior experience should inquire with JCCC.

The Introductory Course is divided into 5 stages:

(1) Hassetsu (The Eight Stages of Shooting and Posture)

(2) Gomu-yumi (Practice Bow)

(3) Subiki (Drawing the bow without an arrow)

- (4) Makiwara (Shooting towards a short-distance target)
- (5) Taihai (formalized movements)
- By the time the course finishes, students will have acquired the basic skill

and knowledge required to join the regular class and continue on to the next level.

Fees: \$220 + HST (Please note that JCCC Membership is also required.)

Equipment: Please wear loose, comfortable clothes and socks. All other equipment will be provided.

Classes are restricted to those 16 years & over.

There will be no classes on **December 24 and 31, 2016**. Please note that some classes may be cancelled as a result of schedule changes requested by the JCCC or other circumstances. If this does happen, the course will be extended beyond March 18 to make a total of 15 classes. It is not mandatory to attend all 15 classes. If you cannot attend one or two classes, there are enough instructors and assistants available, so that those who miss a class can receive missed instruction the following week. However, we encourage everyone to attend as many classes as possible because material in each class will build on the previous classes.

Registration Procedure

- 1. As a prerequisite to registration, all potential candidates must visit and watch a regular kyudo class for at least a half hour between 11:30am-12:30pm on any Saturday from September 10 to November 5.
- 2. At the class, please introduce yourself to one of the instructors to have your name recorded on a list indicating that you have visited a class, thereby meeting the registration pre-requisite. Please note that being on this list does not necessarily guarantee you a spot in the beginners' course. The intent of the visit is to ensure that you have some understanding of a typical kyudo class before deciding to join the course, so please feel free to ask questions while you are there.
- 3. Formal registration starts Tuesday November 8, 2016 and you must register directly with the JCCC by phone or in person. The class size is limited to 20 people and spaces will be filled on a first come, first served basis starting November 8. You must pay at the time of your registration and your name must be on the aforementioned list in order to officially join the course.

A Call for Justice: Fighting For **Japanese Canadian Redress** (1977 - 1988)**JCCC Gallerv**

August 14 to October 26, 2016

The JCCC is proud to be hosting A Call for Justice: Fighting for Japanese Canadian Redress (1977-1988), a touring exhibit curated by the Nikkei National Museum and Cultural Centre in Burnaby, BC. A Call for Justice tells a story of human rights and the enduring perseverance of the Japanese Canadian community, who suffered so much through the Second World War. This powerful story examines the hard work of a dedicated group of community members who, for over 10 years, strategized, argued and debated with the government, while fighting criticism from the press and from their own community. The exhibit features artefacts and archival materials from the Redress period as well as artwork inspired by the Redress movement.

As part of A Call for Justice, the JCCC is hosting a number of events in addition to the official opening which took place on August 14.

On Wednesday September 21, 2016 Heritage is hosting a book reading by Lynne Kutsukake. Ms. Kutsukake has

been named one of the top five new authors and will be reading from her new book The Translation of Love.

In late October Heritage co-hosting а is panel discussion on the after effects of Japanese Canadian Redress with the Canada Race Relations Foundation. The map contains an alphabetical list of the original residents of Tashme, as well as the location of many of the auxiliary buildings at the camp.

さて夏の食を代表するものの一つに'かき氷'がありますが、日本ではいつからかき氷を食べていたのでしょうか?記録に 残る最初のかき氷は平安時代です。清少納言の枕草子に、刃物で削った氷に甘味料をかけて金属のお椀に入れた、との記述

があります。もちろんその時代にはかき氷とは呼ばれていませんでしたが。当時は高貴な人々のみが口にするもので、一般にも広まったのは 明治から昭和初期だと言われています。明治2年に横浜の馬車道に日本で初めてのかき氷が開かれたとの記録がありますね。海外にも様々な スタイルのかき氷があり、特に日本よりも暑い季節の続くアジアでは年中食べる事が出来ます。フルーツなどトッピングが盛りだくさんなのも アジア圏かき氷の特徴でしょうか。フィリピンの'ハロハロ'や台湾のマンゴーかき氷などは日本でも知られていますね。ちなみに、先月7月25日 は'かき氷の日'でした。暑い夏の日には、ご自宅で独自のかき氷を作ってみるのも楽しいかも知れません。

2015年度JICA研修報告 日系社会次世代育成

日修学院(中等部) グラハム智樹

僕は2015年6月17日から7月15日まで日系社会次世代育成研修の おかげで日本に勉強しに行きました。5月に合格が決まった時不安 だった事と楽しみだった事がありました。

まず、楽しみにしていた事:日本で一ヶ月間過ごし、日本語を沢 山練習する事です。また、中学校の体験入学で野球部に参加する事 です。

不安だったこと:初めて一人で飛行機に乗る事が不安でした。 パスポートとか、搭乗券の大事な書類をなくさないように気をつけ ないといけなかったからです。また、スペイン語圏から来た他の研 修生と会話が出来ない事が心配でした。しかし、英語を話せたので 友達になれました。

日系社会次世代育成研修ではドミニカ共和国、メキシコ、コロ ンビア、ベネズエラとカナダから 日系人が13人選ばれて、日本に一 ヶ月間過ごしました。今回はメキシコから3人、ドミニカ共和国から 4人、コロンビアから1人、ベネズエラから1人、それにカナダから4人 が参加しました。日本の文化を習ったり、日本の中学校に行ったり、 ホームステイをしたり、自分の家族の歴史を勉強しました。

カナダからは、みんな違う州から来ました。僕はトロントの日修 学院で勉強しています。ビクトリアから来たあやさんはビクトリアへ リテッジ日本語学校で勉強しています。バンクーバーから来た泰君 はJEC日本語教育センターで日本語を勉強しています。それに、モ ントリオールから来た有美さんはモントリオール日本語センターで 日本語を勉強しています。みんな二人部屋や三人部屋に分かれて、 JICA横浜国際センターで男子は6階、女子は7階に泊まりました。僕 はメキシコからの子と、ドミニカ共和国からの子と三人部屋でした。

JICA横浜国際センターで、ほとんど毎日勉強していました。算 数でそろばんの使い方を習いました。科学で青少年センターでコン ピューターでレゴのロボットをコントロールしました。それに技術と 工芸で和紙の作り方を習ったり、竹でお箸の作り方を習って自分の お箸を作りました。コースターも作りました。一番つらかった事は、 毎日宿題があったことです。

JICA横浜で使っていたスケジュールは朝の7時から8時に起き て、JICAのユニフォームに着替えます。それから3階の食堂で朝食バ イキングを食べます。唐揚げやコロッケもありますが、ご飯とかみそ 汁もあります。食事はとても美味しかったです。9時から朝のミーティ ングがあります。授業で何をするかを話します。9時半から12時20分 まで授業があります。12時半から2時までは昼食です。2時から5時ま ではまた授業です。5時15分から7時50分までは夕食を食べます。5 時15分から7時50分までは外出できます。8時からは夜のミーティン グです。次の日でなにをするかを話します。

JICAでは、週末は休日です。日本に親戚のいる人は外泊できます。外泊しなかったみんなは部屋でテレビを見たり、近くのワールド ポーターズへ遊びに行って、そのローソンで蒸しパンやアイスクリ 26ムを買ったりしていました。 ワールドポーターズでお店は多いです。1階はレストランで、2 階と3階は化粧品や洋服や靴を売っています。4階はインテリアデザ イン商品で、5階はゲームセンターやレストランがありました。僕の 友達はゲームセンターで1万円以上無駄使いしました。僕はUFOキ ャッチャーでぬいぐるみが取れました。楽しかったです。

6月24日に小谷戸の里というところで田植えや餅つきなどをし ました。竹馬や竹とんぼで遊びました。田植えは楽しかったです。ま た、竹とんぼを作ったり、餅つきもしました。

中学校体験では、僕は横浜吉田中学校に行きました。毎日の授 業や放課後の野球部の練習に参加しました。思っていたほど厳しく なかったです。それにみんなは結構さわいでいたり、授業中昼寝を していた人もいました。

ホームステイもありました。日本の家族と一緒に週末を過ごし ました。僕のホームステイ家族は太田さん家族でした。太田家族は 4人家族で、お父さん、お母さん、妹さんとお兄さんがいました。妹さ んは7歳でお兄さんは10歳でした。太田家族は僕ともう一人の研修 生の恵次君と鎌倉の大仏を見に連れて行ってくれました。
