Joy Kogawa's NAOMI'S ROAD – THE OPERA coming to JCCC

Joy Kogawa recently approached me with the idea of mounting a production of Naomi's Road in Toronto. It had been ten years since as a student I had understudied the world premiere of this remarkable show in Vancouver, and was so excited at the prospect of bringing this beautiful show to Ontario for the first time.

This remarkable story is set in Vancouver during the Second World War and tells the story of one Japanese Canadian family among many, who are forced to leave their homes and move to camps in the mountains. One of the most powerful elements of this piece is that it is "Naomi's Road"; that is, it is told from the point of view of the young girl, Naomi. It is a powerful message told through a more gentle voice. Her "road", her journey from life in Vancouver to life far away from home teaches us important lessons about strength and humanity and a child's ability to adapt and grow in any situation.

We live in a time where Japanese-Canadians are fully integrated and hold an integrated place in the greater Canadian whole..., yet at the same time the fear of the violent and subversive "other", once reserved for Japanese-Canadians, continues to be a part of the North American narrative for other ethnicities and religions. Please join us to remember this powerful story and celebrate its survivors through music and storytelling.

An Important New Film from Japanese-Canadian Filmmaker Jeff Chiba Stearns

When being mixed race is more than just an identity, it's a matter of life of death.

Award-winning Japanese Canadian filmmaker Jeff Chiba Stearns' (One Big Hapa Family) new documentary explores the crisis in identifying bone marrow and cord blood donors to donate to patients of mixed ethnicity suffering from life threatening blood diseases such as leukemia.

Annually, 30,000 North Americans are diagnosed with life threatening blood diseases and for many, a bone marrow transplant is the only chance at survival. Of the seven million registered bone marrow donors in the US,



less than 3% are multiethnic. Finding a multiethnic marrow match in the public registry is akin to finding a needle in a haystack.



Mixed Match tells an important human story from the perspective of youth who discover their identities through their deadly illnesses and how their multiethnic backgrounds threaten their chances at survival. With the help of the US organization Mixed Marrow, and first-hand stories from patients and their supporters, this powerful film raises critical awareness about the need for multiethnic donors worldwide.

1977 marked the 100th Anniversary of the arrival of Manzo Nagano, recognized as the first registered Japanese Canadian, in Canada. Recently, during a summer cleanup at the JCCC, eighteen large red and white Centennial flags were found and

turned over to the Archives. These flags are now being catalogued, cleaned up where necessary and rehoused within our storage areas. Ijusha Symposium: Footprints of the New Japanese Immigrant Register Now!

The Ijusha Symposium: Footprints of the New Japanese Immigrant, is an opportunity to capture our oral histories about the Ijusha immigration to Canada. Presended in Japanese with English interpretation The goals of this symposium are:

- to hear and share stories about our immigration experiences
- identify patterns that emerge from our stories
- begin to collect information that will inform others about our heritage


The Symposium begins with a panel moderated by Momo Podolsky. The panel consists of three ljusha who each represent a different experience and perspective of immigration. Each will talk about:

- what motivated them to begin their life in Canada
- the challenges they faced and how they overcame them
- · what they have gained from their experience and
- their next steps

Representing the Ijusha family is Natsu Dolbel, a mother of three children, who has served the Japanese community in Halton region for over 10 years. Some of her contributions are leading Japanese Parent and Child programs, Japanese preschool, Japanese book library/ story time, and facilitating workshops.

Mr. Kinya Kato who came to Canada in 1968 as a skilled immigrant is representing the Ijusha community perspective. In 1990 and 1991, he served as President of the Toronto New Japanese Canadian Association. One of Kato-san's most notable contributions to the community has been the creation of the local Kohaku Utagassen, an event that has again been revived at the JCCC. After retiring from business, Mr. Kato continues to help many Ijusha families with his passion as a home renovator.

Mr. Shinichiro Kawai is our third panel member who represents the business community. After retiring from the Japan Foundation, Mr. Kawai immigrated to Canada in 1975 and worked as a freelance interpreter and media coordinator before establishing Japan Communications Inc. in 1984. His company specializes in connecting cross-cultural communication between Japan and the English-speaking world and focuses on translation, cross-cultural consulting, and serving as an advertising agency among other things.







したものですか?ちょっと立ち止まって、静かに耳を澄ませてみましょう。

私の年齢になると(いよいよ65歳、シニア世代に突入!)、これまで大した病気もせずに頑張ってくれた胃、小腸、大腸、心臓や腎臓などの働きに、自然と「ありがとうネ」という気持ちになります。息苦しさを感じずに歩ける、美味しく食べることができる、下痢や便秘をせずに過ごせる等・・・何気ない日々に感謝です。若い頃はそんな風にちっとも思いませんでした。この元気さは永遠のものと感じていたし、老いを全く意識していませんでした。若い読者の皆さま!あ・な・た・もやがて行く道なのですよ。

現在は様々な情報に溢れています。健康情報を容易に、しかも 大量に手に入れることができます。でも、それらの情報をどのくらい 役立てることができているでしょう?知識は増えても、これまでのやり 方を変えるのはなかなか容易ではありません。まずは"最も大事と思 うことから始めましょう。"それを習慣づけていけば他の事柄にも興 味・関心が生まれ、少しずつ食行動の改善へ、と連鎖していきます。

私の友人は、二人目妊娠の際に糖尿病を指摘されました。責任ある仕事をこなしながら糖尿病について学び、検査結果と照らし合わせて食生活&運動を工夫。定年の頃にはデータが改善し、服薬治療が中止になりました。年齢と共に悪化するのが一般的・・・彼女の根気強い努力は正に"継続は力なり"を示しています。

生活習慣病に共通する食の基本は「栄養素をバランス良く摂る、塩分を控える、食べ過ぎない、食物繊維を十分に摂る、飽和脂肪酸(肉のあぶら身、バターなど)を控える」と言えます。まだ病気を指摘されていない皆さま、是非に行動を始めましょう!既に指摘されている皆さまはスペシャリストと相談しながら、そして身体の声を聴きながら、上記の基本に加えて、あなた自身の病気に合った食事療法を工夫していきましょう!




