An Evening with Kodo's Chieko Kojima & Nagata Shachu

Chieko Kojima, founding member and principal dancer of Kodo, joins Nagata Shachu taiko group in an evening of dance, drums and song.

The JCCC and Nagata Shachu are proud to present Japanese dance and taiko artist Chieko Kojima. A founding member of the world renowned Kodo drummers of Sado Island, Kojima also has an active solo career that is perhaps best characterized by her ongoing project, "Yukiai". Also she seeks out new encounters and collaborations with



artists and taiko groups within Japan and throughout the world. Kojima is known for her original dancing style during Kodo's taiko-based performances, which is best exemplified by her vivid portrayal of the goddess Ameno-uzume



in the first season of "Amaterasu" in 2006, directed by Tamasaburo Bando. She became a Kodo Distinguished Member in 2012, and was the director of the annual concert series "Kodo Special Performances on Sado Island" for four years, starting from its inaugural season that same year. She continues to ambitiously broaden her expressive outlets, as demonstrated by her recent productions based on the "Tales of Dojoji," which then became the inspiration for her first photo book, "Kasane no Kiyohime Monogatari: The Myriad Layers of Kiyohime," a unique work created with photographer Maiko Miyagawa and released in 2015.

For this performance, Kojima will share the stage in collaboration with Canada's premiere taiko group Nagata Shachu, for an unforgettable evening of dance, drums and song.

Chirashi Sushi

An array of art works from 1972 to 2016 by BRYCE KANBARA selected by Akira Yoshikawa

"Chirashi sushi is one of my favourites on the menu and the words suggest a scattering of works as well as something delicious." Bryce Kanbara.

If there is one person who is the focal point of visual art in the Japanese Canadian community, it is Bryce Kanbara.

Over a 40 year career,



Kanbara has been an artist, advocate, gallery owner, juror, grants officer and curator, but he has never had a show of his own at the JCCC Gallery. Thanks to the energy and inspiration of Akira Yoshikawa, who is the curatorial lead-hand of the exhibit, the reserved and thoughful Kanbara will be coaxed into the spotlight for Chirashi Sushi.

"Over the years, Bryce has been an active and prolific artist and there is so much to exhibit," says Curator Yoshikawa. "He works in a variety of mediums and is always experimenting with sculpture, mono prints, collage and even plywood and drywall constructs. You get the feeling he is always on the move. He never stays static."

Yoshikawa identifies eight different stages in Kanbara's art career that will be showcased in the exhibit. In each, he will show the European influences in Kanbara's artwork as well as his Japanese values.

Born and raised in Hamilton Ontario, Kanbara entered university with no intention of going into art.

"In first year, I took natural science courses because of expectations from friends and family," says Kanbara. "Art was not considered a profession to pursue. But then in first year

I flunked out of sciences and I think that was trying to tell me something."

Kanbara began to pursue art in his elective courses and eventually rented a studio space after graduating from university. It's a very good thing for all of us that Kanbara switched to art. He continued to create art, stay involved with the Japanese Canadian community and be an ongoing promoter of Japanese Canadian artists.

"His work is very eclectic," says Yoshikawa. "When I look at it, I can feel his spirit and enthusiasm for life. It will be an exciting show."
