



Hachioji Kuruma Ningyo Puppet Theatre Returns



Legendary Japanese puppet master Koryu Nishikawa V returns to Toronto with Hachioji Kuruma Ningyo for the company's first full-scale production – featuring chanters and shamisen performers - at the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre.



The company will perform three female-focused stories from classic Japanese literature: Kuzunoha, about a mother's undying love for her child; Tsuri On'na, a comical piece about "fishing" for a wife and Yugao, a new work from Nishikawa based on a story from Murasaki Shikibu's classic epic The Tale of Genji, in

which the jealous spirit of one of Genji's lovers possesses a young woman he's courting.

Kuruma ningyo, literally meaning "puppets on wheels," refers to Nishikawa's unique technique in which the puppeteer sits atop a three-wheeled dolly, adding an element of dynamism and power to each of these awe-inspiring female characters from classical literature.

Last but far from least, JCCC then presented certificates to the 20 recipients of the Ontario Volunteer Service Awards for 2018.

The Ontario Volunteer Service Award program is administered by the Ministry of Citizenship, Immigration and International Trade. To qualify for an award, an adult recipient will have volunteered for a minimum of 5 years continuously. A youth recipient will have volunteered for a minimum of 2 years. Each year, the JCCC has the opportunity to nominate 18 adult recipients and up to 3 youth recipients. In addition to our own event, these recipients were recognized by the province of Ontario at an awards ceremony held in June.

The JCCC appreciates the many talents and skills of their volunteers. Their energy and enthusiasm are a part of the JCCC's programs, events and just about every other aspect of the operation of the Centre. Arigato Day is just a small measure of our gratitude.

Arigatou Party for Obata Shihan of the JCCC Aikikai

An Arigatou Party was held on Sunday October 14 to wish Obata Shihan well on his return to Japan after many rewarding years as chief instructor of the JCCC Aikikai. More than 100 people attended the party held in the Kamo room of the JCCC. Current and past members of the JCCC Aikikai were in attendance along with long time friends and associates of Obata Shihan and several distinguished guests. These included Gary Kawaguchi, President of the JCCC; Kiyoshi Matsui, former Chief Instructor; Takeshi Kimeda Shihan, 9th Dan, Yoshinkan and Marty Kobayashi, former President of the JCCC.

Osamu Obata Shihan began studying Aikido in 1967 in Tokyo at the Senshu University Aikido Club under Shihego Tanaka Shihan, 9th Dan, Meiji Jingu-Shiseikan Budojo. He became shodan the followng year and was awarded the rank of 7th dan in 2003. Obata Shihan became a senior instructor for the JCCC Aikikai in 1972 and has since taught and overseen the testing and promotion of hundreds of aikidoka at this facility. Obata Shihan is succeeded by Adrian Iliescu as chief instructor of the JCCC Aikikai.

Among other distinctions, Obata Shihan received a commendation from the Consul-General to Japan in recognition of his contributions to Japan-Canada relations through his work as an officer of the consulate as well as through his "tireless instruction of aikido". Obata Shihan has also received the Ontario Volunteer Service Award and the Ishizue Award recognizing his 45 years of volunteer instruction at the JCCC. Furthermore, Obata Shihan founded the International Friendship Seminars which rotate between Japan, the United Kingdom, Singapore, Belgium and Canada.

Attendees enjoyed a buffet lunch while listening to messages of congratulations from the distinguished guests present and to messages from prominent members of the aikido community from around the world read by current members of the JCCC Aikikai. Noteworthy among these were the kind words sent by Ueshiba Moriteru, Doshu of the Aikikai Foundation. All were delighted when Mrs. Takako Ito, the Consul-General of Japan in Toronto, arrived with her husband to acknowledge Obata Shihan's accomplishments and to express her warm wishes for the Obatas' return to Japan.

The party also included the presentation of a gift from members of the JCCC Aikikai, an original song "Doumo Arigatou Obata Shihan" accompanied by a lively and stimulating choreographed dance, and some karaoke kicked off by Obata



Shihan himself with a rousing acapella rendition of what he termed "aikido music".

From backyard dinners and local events to Friendship Seminars and trips to Japan, Obata Shihan has been an essential part of making the practice of aikido a fun and fulfilling experience for many through the years. All members of the JCCC Aikikai wish Obata Shihan and Akemi Obata a safe and happy return to Japan where the Obatas will take up residence in Obata Shihan's home town of Yanai in the Yamaguchi Prefecture. While we look forward to crossing paths with the Obatas in the future we will, in the meantime, strive to achieve Obata Shihan's vision of Jitta Ittai; helping each other grow together.

JCCC Naginata Club Wins National Championship

The JCCC Naginata Club team, consisting of Mary Phan, Abigail Lim, Susan Davis, Jordan Macklem, and Tomas Almonte, won the gold medal at the 2018 Canadian Naginata Federation national championship tournament in Montreal on Sunday October 21, defeating the team from McGill University by four matches to one. The McGill team was led by former JCCC instructor Marija Landekic. The Edmonton Kendo and Naginata Club, led by former JCCC instructor Dan Bouchard, defeated the University of Toronto Naginata Club in the third place match to take the bronze medal.

In the individual championship, it was an all-JCCC final, as former instructor Marija Landekic defeated current instructor Jordan Macklem to capture her fourth individual championship. Lutan Liu and Mika Sneyd of the University of Toronto Naginata Club also took second place in the engi kyogi (choreographed skills competition) division.

In the dangai (beginner) divisions, Gabriel Conquer of the University of Toronto Naginata Club brought home two silver medals, taking second in the dangai individual championship, and also coming second in the dangai engi kyogi division with his partner Milton Chow, also of the University of Toronto.

The national championship tournament was preceded by a seminar featuring visiting instructors from Japan and the United States, and a rank promotion exam in which a record of fifteen dan ranks were awarded, including five sandan and four nidan promotions for Toronto students.

"This was an outstanding weekend for Naginata in Canada," said JCCC head instructor Susan Davis. "Obviously, I'm proud of how our own students did, but the level of practice and competition that everyone across Canada showed was visibly much better than it had been in previous years, especially at the lower ranks. And now we have a critical mass of students who are senior enough to become qualified referees, which will improve our competition further in years to come."

Next on the agenda for the JCCC Naginata Club are the tryouts for the Canadian team for next summer's World Naginata Championships in Germany. Canada is among the countries favoured to seriously contend for medals, having won bronze medals at each of the two previous World Championships.

健やかな老後をめざして その19

身体の元気はまず歯と歯茎から!

自分の歯で噛むことが健康にとって非常に大切です。入れ歯なしで生涯を過ごしたいと、誰しも願っています。私自身も8020(80歳になっても20本以上を保つ)を目指して努力しています。60代後半の今28本すべてが揃っており、歯科医より「歯茎の状態はとても良好」と太鼓判をもらっています。

歯をなくす主たる原因は歯周病とむし歯。特に、歯周病は40歳を過ぎると急激に増えます。原因はプラーク(歯垢:しこう)に潜んでいる歯周病菌。ですから、プラー



クが増えると歯周病菌が増え、歯周組織に炎症が起こります。歯茎が腫れている状態が進行すると歯と歯茎の隙間が深くなり、歯周ポケット(溝)ができ、その中で歯周病菌が増えて、さらに炎症が悪化します。そして、歯を支えている骨などを破壊していき、重度になると容易に歯が抜け落ちていきます!健康な人と比べると歯周病が進行した人の場合、歯茎は下がり、歯の根元が露出しています。こうなると、むし歯にもなりやすいのです。

歯周病が怖いのは、口腔内の健康だけにとどまらず全身に様々な 影響を及ぼすからです。歯周病で生じる炎症物質によって血糖値の 高い状態が続いたり、脂肪をためこみ安くなって肥満が促進された り、動脈硬化が進み安くなったりします。歯を失って、あるいは入れ歯 になって充分に噛むことができなくなると、脳への刺激が少なくなっ て認知機能低下のリスクが高まる、とも言われています。

歯茎がむずがゆい、歯がしみる、歯磨きすると出血する、食べ物が挟まり安くなった、口腔内がネバネバする、歯が長くなった(歯茎が下がった)、歯がグラグラする等の症状はありませんか?多く当てはまるほど歯周炎の可能性は高まるので、是非に受診しましょう。早期にアクションを起こすことが健康維持の秘訣です。

歯石はプラークがミネラルを吸着して硬くなったもの。たくさんの穴があり、そこにも細菌が住み着いています。むし歯と歯周病の予防には正しい歯磨き、そして定期的にクリーニング(プラーク&歯石の除去)や検診を受けることが大事です。私は電動歯ブラシ、歯間ブラシとデンタルクロスを使っていますが、それでもやはり十分ではありません。むし歯検査を年1回、クリーニングを4か月ごとに受けています。手用&超音波用スケーラーで歯石を削り取る際に痛みがありますが、スケーラーの音を聞きながら「歯や歯茎がきれいになっている~~8020達成へ近づいている~~」と思うと気持ちはルンルンで、その痛みさえ有難くなってしまうのです(笑)。

日常で気をつけていることはしっかり噛む(特に繊維のある野菜や硬い肉)、甘いものや酸っぱいものを食べたら直ぐ水や茶を飲む(むし歯予防)、毎食後なるべく早く歯を磨く、夜中に起きた際は水を少し飲む(すすぐ)等。

料理や水分補給、歯磨きなどに活用しているナノバブル水素水には抗炎症作用があるので、刺激物で口の中や歯茎に炎症が起こっても直ぐに改善するようになりました。これも、私が口腔内の健康を保っている理由の1つと言えるでしょう。


