

Sedai Is Now Live on Vimeo!

Sedai, the Japanese Canadian Legacy Project, started off as a pilot program with the primary objective of recording and preserving the history and experiences of Japanese Canadians through oral history. Today, over 200 interviews had been recorded. While most interviews are used for research purposes, the Sedai committee worked tirelessly to offer the public access to these interviews. In 2008, www.sedai.ca launched successfully to increased accessibility of Japanese Canadian's oral history to the public. Fast-forward eleven years later in 2019, with the ease of use and increasing popularity of video-based platform, Sedai has joined the video platform Vimeo - a secure, user friendly platform for viewing the hundreds of videos that sedai has recordedIn addition. a select video will be featured on a monthly basis on the JCCC website through the Heritage page so be sure to keep your eyes out for that! 

In the spirit of celebrating the 90th Anniversary of Canada-Japan diplomatic relations, The Japan Foundation, Toronto presents AGA-SHIO, a piano and Tsugaru-shamisen duo that blends the passionate energy of Japanese folk music together with contemporary music, creating an entirely new form of Japanese music. AGA-SHIO are Hiromitsu Agatsuma on the three stringed Tsugaru-shamisen, and Satoru Shionoya on Piano.

About AGA-SHIO

The two musicians met in 2004 and put out their first album AGA-SHIO in 2009. AGA-SHIO has toured across Japan and also around the globe to 13 countries in Europe and Africa.

About the Artists

Hiromitsu Agatsuma [Shamisen Player], began playing the Tsugaru-shamisen at age six. He had become a renowned performer in the traditional Japanese music scene even in his youth, and made his major debut in 2001. His first and sixth albums won the prestigious "Japan Gold Disk Award"; his second album was released in the United States in 2003, for which he made his first tour overseas. He has performed in Australia, Brazil, and Russia, as well as in various countries throughout Asia and Europe. Agatsuma has collaborated with numerous artists such as Marcus Miller and Herbie Hancock.

Satoru Shionoya [Pianist/Composer/Producer], studied music composition at Tokyo University of the Arts. As a student he started his 10 year career as the pianist of the Japanese salsa band Orquesta De La Luz (1986-1996). The group won the United Nations Peace Medal in 1993 and was a U.S. Grammy Award nominee in 1995. During this time, he performed with Tito Puente, Dave Valentin and Santana. While with the group he started working as a solo artist in 1993, and has released over 12 original albums to date. His musical activities are diverse, composing and arranging scores in a wide array of genres including jazz, pop, classical, big band and for full orchestras.

The JCCC Kyudo club, Seikyukai, is celebrating its tenth year at JCCC. With the support of the JCCC, its volunteers and under the leadership of Mie Takahashi sensei, Kyudo has developed into a significant part of the JCCC martial arts program.

Opportunities for regular kinteki practice (28-meter shooting) – an essential element in Kyudo practice – is limited at the JCCC. To supplement, Seikyukai has been renting a gymnasium facility at Brock University. Kyudo equipment (arrow stands and backstop net) are transported to the Brock University each time. The

arrow stands in use at JCCC were not intended to be portable and, thus, are bulky and heavy. The improvised backstop net hanger system is dependent on the availability of two portable basketball backboards, which are provided by Brock University.

To address the difficulties in equipment, University of Toronto 1st year engineering students were tasked this year with the design and development of a portable arrow

stand and a portable backstop net hanger system, as part of the Engineering, Strategy and Practice course. After three months of team work including three meetings with a Seikyukai volunteer, each team came up with a well thought out design solution. The arrow stand holds about twice as many arrows as the original stand, while it weighs only about 20% of the original, and, when folded for transport, it is approximately 1/4 of the size. The net hanger is self-supporting, compact and easy to assemble and disassemble.


The time and effort the student teams put into these projects is very much appreciated. The outcome is win-win.



健やかな老後をめざして その22

近年増加している「加齢黄斑変性!!

加齢黄斑変性(かれいおうはんへんせい)とは、加齢によって網膜(眼の最も奥)の中心にある黄斑部が変性し、視野の中心がゆがんだり、ぼやけて見えたりする病気です。加齢により網膜に老廃物が溜まり続けて炎症を起こす、あるいは網膜の細胞が委縮して症状が進行します。特に黄斑部は視力を決める非常に大切な場所なので、この部分の障害は失明するリスクを高めます。両目で見ると脳が見えない部分を補ってしまうため、異常に気付きにくいのです。

脂質の多い食生活が関係しているとも言われ、欧米では成人が中途失明する原因の第1位です。日本でも食生活の欧米化によって年々増加しています。ある日、健康そのものの友人Aさんから「この頃、遠近感が取りにくいと感じていたの。ニンジンを切ろうとしたら、ナイフをあてた部分がぼやけている!」と電話がありました。「加齢黄斑変性かもしれないので、一刻も早く受診して!」と伝えました。

Aさんは月1回の眼球注射を3か月続けて、症状が改善しました。 もちろん患者によって反応は異なるので、経過観察しながら、注射 の間隔やその他の治療法との併用が決められていきます。コンタクトレンズさえ入れた経験がない私は、眼球注射と聞くだけで腰が引 けますが(笑)、彼女から「局所麻酔するので痛みはほとんどなかっ たよ」と聞いて、ちょっと安心しました。

症状が改善しても、継続した検査と治療が必要です。Aさんの場合、その後も数か月ごとに注射を受けています。一般的に1年を過ぎると注射の間隔は延びていきます。完治が難しいとは言え、治療法が進歩しているので、何よりも早期発見が重要です。

加齢黄斑変性チェック用紙(アムスラーチャート:1つのマス目が5 mmほどの方眼紙)を作ることが出来ます。縦横に格子状の線を引き、中央に黒い点を描きます。眼鏡やコンタクトを外さずに、30cm離して片目で黒い点を見詰めます。真ん中がゆがんだり、暗くぼやけたりしませんか?さあ、家族や友人とチェックしてみましょう!

予防の第一は食生活です。酸化ストレス(活性酸素の増加により体内の酸化が進んだ状態)は網膜の老廃物を増加させます。その酸化ストレスを減らすために、抗酸化ビタミン(ビタミンC、ビタミンEなど)、 β カロテンやルテインを多く含む緑黄色野菜、DHAやEPAを多く含む青魚などをしっかり摂りましょう。当地で手軽に手に入るサーモンも抗酸化作用の強い魚です。脂質の多い食品には注意しましょう。

次に、禁煙!喫煙すると血液中の酸化ストレスが増えます。これこそが、いろんな病気において禁煙が勧められる理由なのです。また、強い光は黄斑部の細胞に影響を与えます。サングラス、日傘やつばの広い帽子などで目を守りましょう。

活性酸素は身体にとって必要なものですが、ストレスの多い現代社会では体内に異常に増加し、細胞のサビや遺伝子異常(ガン化)を促進させ、病気の主たる原因であることが明らかになっています。体内の活性酸素をいかに減らすか(抗酸化)、それが健康寿命のカギと言えるでしょう。

私の場合は、抗酸化作用の強いナノバブル水素水を1日1.5リットル以上飲用し、調理にも使っています。水は身体の半分以上を占めているのですから、どのような水を摂るかを何よりも大事に考えています。


