

The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre (JCCC) has multiple spaces dedicated to exhibitions and programming showcasing artistic and cultural practices of Canadian and International artists of Japanese descent and of the larger Asian community. With over 10,000 art and artefacts in the JCCC's collection, visitors will experience the best of art and cultural heritage of the Japanese Canadians throughout the Cultural Centre.

The Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre (MNHC) is a multi-use museum space that houses the JCCC's permanent exhibition, 5 Generations. Located in the epicenter of the cultural centre, the MNHC is the hub of the JCCC's heritage programming. The JCCC Gallery is a space with 1800 square foot and 156 linear feet of wall space. Located next to the museum, the JCCC Gallery showcases the best of contemporary Nikkei artists. The Heritage Lounge Display Case is located next to the entrance of the JCCC Gallery and showcases temporary exhibitions. The Nikkei Heritage Wing, with a location next to the main entrance of the JCCC, is one of JCCC's premiere cultural spaces exhibiting a wide range of artistic practices from photography to architecture in the Japanese Canadian community.

The JCCC Gallery, Heritage Lounge Display Case, and Nikkei Heritage Wing is currently accepting exhibition proposal. Proposals should include artist(s)' resume(s) and artist's exhibition statement.

Exhibition proposal should include but is not limited to:

- Preliminary title.
- Identify roles of all applicants.
- Description of concept.
- Details of additional programming such as artist talks or workshop.
