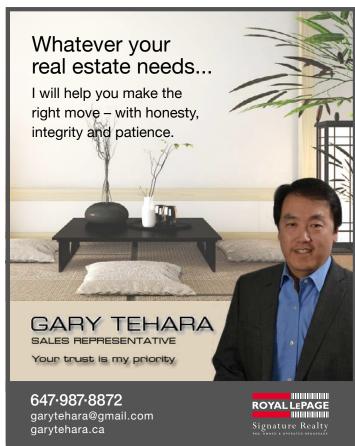

The JCCC is committed to the safety and the well-being of our staff, volunteers, members, visitors and community. We continue to take all reasonable steps to ensure risks to health and safety are identified, assessed and managed appropriately. In accordance with the Province of Ontario's reopening plan, as of March 1, 2022, proof of vaccination will no longer be required to enter the JCCC. However, for the foreseeable future the JCCC will require participants in registered programs including martial arts, cultural classes and clubs to be fully vaccinated. Full vaccination is also required for staff, instructors and volunteers. Other protective measures, such as mask/face covering requirements, social distancing, hand-washing and active/passive screening of patrons, will remain in place.

Greeting from the Executive Director 館長メッセージ

It was two years ago this month that the JCCC, and the world, shut down in the face of COVID-19 pandemic. Two years after the fact we find ourselves well into our reopening and March 2022 finds many programs and events back again.

This month all of our martial arts programs return to full pre-pandemic schedules, and classes like Hula, Ikenobo Ikebana and Bunka Shishu start their Spring programs. Films are back in the Kobayashi Hall, the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre is open, a new exhibition, Origami - The Art of Paper Folding, will be unveiled in JCCC Gallery, and we are working to reopen the library very soon. Planning for June's Toronto Japanese Film Festival is well underway and we plan to deliver the festival onsite. The Haru Matsuri is online but our spectacular hina doll display will be set up and available to visit at the entrance of the JCCC. We are definitely on the road to recovery.

We are not entirely out of the woods yet though. The board and staff have worked very hard to keep the centre alive and the hub for virtual Japanese and Japanese Canadian culture and heritage. But two years without being able to meet the community and without a significant part of our revenue has been exhausting. As we rebuild, we hope you will continue to support us through donations, renewed membership and participation in our programs and events, and most importantly, through your presence. In the past two years the JCCC has built an exciting new virtual component but after all, the Centre has always been, and always will be, a place for the community and its many friends to gather and celebrate "Friendship through Culture".

In order to do this safely we have put in a lot of work on our health protection policy and protocols, and a dedicated team of volunteers act as vaccination monitors. Most importantly, we have put great efforts into enhancing the safety of the building itself. Please check the article on **page 9** of this newsletter that outlines all the improvements to ventilation and washrooms.

If you haven't been back yet, please come visit again and check out all the positive changes.

全世界がCOVID-19禍に直面しJCCCが閉館したのは、2年前の今月のことでした。その2年後の現在、2022年3月、私達は段階的ではありますが会館をオープンし、色々なプログラムやイベントを実行するところまで来ています。

今月は全ての武道クラスがCOVID以前の形態での活動を再開します。フラダンス、活け花、文化刺繍などは2月から春季クラスが始まっています。小林ホールでの映画上映も始まります。森山日系へリテージセンターも完全にオープンし、"オリガミ-アートの世界"展もJCCCギャラリーでの展示が始まります。ライブラリーは再開に向けて準備中です。トロント日本映画祭も恒例6月の小林ホールでの開催に向けて、作品の選出作業中です。春祭りは今年もオンラインでの開催ですが、会館入り口に雛人形を飾る予定です。私達は確実に復活に向けて前進しています。

しかし、まだ完全に森から抜け出したわけではありません。理事会もスタッフも会館が休眠状態にならないように、また日本人と日系人の拠り所としてのその役目を保たなければと、大変な努力を続けて来ました。正直なところ、2年の間日系社会、会員の皆様とも顔を合わせることもできず、またその間会館への収入が大幅に減ったこともあり、理事会、スタッフは精神的に非常につらい状態でした。ここから再開するにあたり、会員の皆様にはドネーションをしたり、メンバーシップを更新したり、イベントやプログラムに積極的に参加したりなど、皆様ができる方法で引き続きで支援を頂ければ幸いです。そしてなにより皆様の存在こそが会館にとって一番大切なのです。過去2年の間にJCCCはオンラインやバーチャルでのプログラムやイベントを行い好評でした。しかしJCCCはこれまでずっとそうであったように、これからも日系コミュニティの場所であり続けなければなりません。そして"文化がわかる、心が通う"を体現する場所としてあり続けなければなりません。

Karen Gordon

Karen Gordon's route to the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre started more than a decade ago when she bumped into a former work colleague, Chris Hope, at a neighbourhood drug store. That chance meeting led to her working with him as story editor and co-writer on his feature documentary. "Hatsumi" is the story of Chris's grandparents, who met and married in Vancouver, and how the internment of Japanese Canadians during the Second World War affected their lives. A few years later, she sat as a jury member for the Toronto Japanese Fllm Festival. Since then, she and Chris have collaborated on several projects, including the JCCC's videos for both "Keep the Lantern Lit" COVID-era fundraisers.

Documentaries and movies are only part of her career. Karen has a long and varied history in the area of communications, broadcast and writing, across all media and platforms, and has done everything from producing to hosting. She's a writer and story editor for documentary TV and IMAX/Giant Screen. She's just wrapped work on the giant screen film "Serengeti", which starts rolling out internationally in Spring 2022. She's a film critic, and one of the founding members of the movie review website **original-cin.ca**. She's collaborated with celebrity chef David Rocco on three cookbooks, including the award winning "Made In Italy".

Karen is also a media trainer, and performance coach with a background in strategic publicity, marketing and branding. She spent the big hair, big shoulder pad 1980s working in the music industry in Montreal and Toronto.

Japanese Canadian Survivors Health and Wellness Fund (JCSHWF) Awards Two Grants to the JCCC

The Japanese Canadian Survivors Health and Wellness Fund (JCSHWF) came from the efforts of the NAJC's British Columbia Government Redress initiative. At its core the fund primarily focuses on Japanese Canadians who were uprooted and displaced during WWII including those families that left BC during the war and whose children were born out of province from 1942-1949.

In addition to the individual grants that have been awarded, the JCSHWF is providing grants to organizations to enhance programs, activities, and services that will directly benefit the health and well-being of these living survivors.

Organizations were invited to apply for support by detailing programs that would further the JCSHWF's purpose. The JCCC successfully applied for two maximum \$10,000 grants to be used during the 2022 calendar year.

Donna Tsuji is chair of the grant aimed to provide outreach to seniors who, due to health or access issues, are unable to attend and participate in events at the JCCC which may limit their opportunities to socialize with friends and family and engage in Centre activities.

Sharon Marubashi is chair of the grant which will support a one-day special event at the JCCC, celebrating and honouring the JC Survivors who are current/past JCCC members, along with their family and friends.

Details of both programs will be provided along with how to register for them. We encourage those for whom these programs are designed to register and enjoy the support they offer.

JCCC to Launch new Seniors Outreach Program

The JCCC is pleased to announce a pilot for a Seniors Outreach Program funded by the Japanese Canadian Survivors Health and Wellness Fund (JCSHWF). The program is designed for past and current JCCC members who were uprooted and displaced during WWII including those JC families that left BC during the war and whose children were born out of province from 1942-1949. The focus of this Seniors Outreach Program is to support those JC Survivors who would like to stay connected with the Centre but find it difficult to attend in person.

The pilot focuses on providing social connections with the Centre and, through technology such as Zoom, with friends and family. The program will include social visits with a friendly and familiar volunteer or family member who will deliver bento box meals provided by the Centre, remote access to JCCC events, and other resources such as DVD films or books from the lending library. JCCC to host Honour our JC Survivors Day

The JCCC will host an afternoon to celebrate and honor current and past JCCC members who are Japanese Canadian Survivors (Japanese Canadians who were uprooted and displaced during WWII including those families that left B.C. during the war and whose children were born out of province from 1942-1949) with their families and friends. This event will provide the opportunity for the seniors to socialize and re-connect with other senior friends and members of our community, reminisce and share stories of their lives, view archival photos highlighting their pre-war life to post-war times and take part in re-unions for those that were in internment camps. There will be some food and entertainment provided. Also, there will be guided tours of the latest exhibition titled Maru, an examination of the Japanese diaspora including Canada.

Common Areas

- · Changed to Merv 13 (Hepa) Filters in Dojos, Administration Office, the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre including the Library and Tea Room, and Kobayashi Hall to provide improved clean air supply
- · Portable Hepa Air filter units purchased for moveable placement within Centre
- · Adjustment of Air flow in Rooftop HVAC's to increase fresh air supply
- · Conversion to Touchless Front Doors
- · Plexiglass Protection installed at Reception for staff/visitors

Washrooms

- · New HEPA Filters added to all washrooms
- · Improved Ventilation/Exhaust System in East Washrooms
- · Changed to Touchless fixtures in all Washrooms
- · Installed new UV/high-capacity hand dryers in East/Dojo/2nd floor Washrooms
- · Installing new Touchless Soap dispensers in all Washrooms

Dojos

- · Three new Exhaust Fans Installed in Dojos to improve air quality (provide clean air by exhausting 'used' air)
- · Two New Circulating High Capacity Fans Installed in Dojos to clear air quickly between classes
- \cdot Improved Ventilation/Exhaust System in Change Rooms and Dojo Washrooms
- · New flooring and fixtures have been added to the Dojo area washrooms

In addition to the specific changes mentioned, you will notice that all of our washrooms have a new look. All of the washrooms have been renovated to provide our visitors with a safe and comfortable experience.

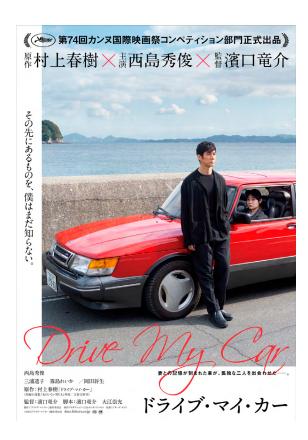

SENIORS' SUPPER CLUB

Chawan Mushi

Ingredients

1 cup cooled dashi

2 egg slightly beaten

1/2 tsp shoyu

4 oz chicken sliced into thin strips

6-8 leaves of baby spinach chopped

2 mushroom washed and sliced *optional*

Sliced water chestnuts

Deveined peeled shrimp

Celery cut into thin matchstick

Sliced kamaboko

* You can make a quick dashi by dissolving 1 tsp hondashi into 1/4 cup boiling water, then adding 3/4 cup cold water to cool it.

Equipment

2 soup or chawan mushi bowls medium sauce pan

Cutting board

Sharp vegetable knife

Small mixing bowl

Measuring cups and spoons

As we get closer to spring, the thought of joyful festivals start to fill our heads. With festivals come special foods, and Chawan Mushi is a perfect celebration food with which to look forward to spring.

Instructions

- 1. In a small bowl, lightly beat egg and add dashi and shoyu. Place chicken, spinach, and mushrooms in bottom of serving bowl. Gently pour soup mixture into the serving bowl.
- 2. Place bowls covered with lid in sauce pan deep enough for a lid to go on. Add enough cold water for the bowls to sit in 1 inch/2 cm of water. Place lid on pot and bring water to boil, then reduce heat to simmer. Simmer for approximately 8-10 minutes. Test to see if done by lightly pushing on the top of the egg mixture with the back of a spoon. If runny egg rises it is not done.
- 3. The soup should look like a custard with a smooth top. The egg needs to be slightly firm, but still silken with no bubbles around the edges as this indicates it is overdone.
- 4. When done carefully remove the bowls from the pot of hot water and place on serving dish.

Storage and Reheating

- · You shouldn't have any. Chawan mushi is too yummy for leftovers.
- Chawan mushi can also be made in the microwave. Follow the directions above, but instead of cooking on the stove, cook in a microwave safe bowl at medium heat for 8-10 minutes. Follow the same guideline for doneness. Microwave power does vary- start at 8 minutes and add time until your chawan mushi is ready.

Nagata Shachu Japanese Taiko and Music Group and the JCCC proudly present "Kaze" featuring master bamboo flutist from Japan, Toki Tatara. Marking the first concert at Kobayashi Hall since the pandemic, Toronto's own Nagata Shachu will collaborate with Tatara in a performance that will seamlessly combine the worlds of shinobue (bamboo flute), taiko, and the three-stringed shamisen while exploring new possibilities for these traditional instruments.

Born in Kyoto, Tatara has spent her musical life in the research of bamboo flutes. She actively composes and performs many of her own works, having cultivated both Japanese traditional and Western classical techniques. In pursuit of the

full potential of the shinobue which is somewhat nostalgic in the souls of the Japanese people, Tatara performs music that touches upon the hearts of this generation. Tatara has recorded several CDs and is the Director of the Japan Shinobue Association, professor at Okayama Niimi Public University, and shinobue music club instructor at the Ueno Gakuen Music University.

健やかな老後をめざして その49

感染症をどう防ぐ!?

ちょうど2年前の3月、初めて行動規制(ロックダウン)を体験し、新型コロナ感染症パンデミック(COVID-19)の怖ろしさを思い知らされました!

冬から春へ変わりつつある季節は特に体調が変化しやすく、感染症にかかりやすくなります。細菌、ウイルスなどの病原微生物が鼻や喉から侵入して呼吸器感染を起こします。かぜ(上気道炎)、インフルエンザ(流行性感冒)、COVID-19、結核などがあります。高齢者(65歳以上)では肺炎を起こすと重症化する割合が高まります。一般的に、肺炎を起こすと38°C以上の発熱、強い咳、黄色や緑色の痰、息苦しさなどが生じます。ところが、体力や免疫機能が落ちている高齢者では典型的な症状が出ないこともあるので「呼吸が浅い、食欲や元気がない」といった症状に注意しましょう。

呼吸器感染症の予防3原則は次の通りです。

1. 予防接種で免疫をつける。

インフルエンザの場合、ワクチン接種の効果はインフルエンザの型によって異なります。COVID-19に関しては次々と変異株が出現し、世界中で使用されている様々なワクチンの効果はまだ検証過程にあります。現時点では「感染率と発症率を減少させ、重症化するリスクを抑える」と報告されています。有効な薬が開発されるまではワクチン接種が非常に重要です。薬剤アレルギーなどある人では、ワクチン製剤による副反応(特にアナフィラキシー反応)に注意する必要があります。

2. 感染経路を絶つ。

流行時はマスクを着用し、なるべく人ごみを避け、帰宅したらうがいと手洗いを励行しましょう!手洗いは、石鹸液で指先と指全体、手の平と甲、手首までしっかり洗います。アルコールを使う際は、手が濡れていると効果が減じるので乾いた手に十分な量をとり、手洗いと同様に丁寧に消毒します。家庭内感染を防ぐために共有場所(トイレ、洗面所や台所のノブ、ハンドル、蛇口など)の清潔に心がけましょう。タオルを共有しないことも大事です。

3. 抵抗力をつける。

感染症にかかっても重症になるかどうかは抵抗力(免疫力や体力)に大きく関連しています。抵抗力が落ちると容易に状態悪化を招きます。COVID-19 は、未知の感染症が急速に肺の状態を悪化させる怖ろしさを突きつけましたね!暮らしの中で抵抗力を高める対策として「適切な食生活と睡眠・休養、持病の管理、免疫の働きを保つ生活」を心がけることが大事です。

睡眠と休養が十分でない状況が長期に続くと、食欲不振や体調不良を招き、免疫力や体力は低下していきます。最近の研究は「侵入した病原体を特に強い力でやっつけるのはリンパ球で、主に睡眠・休養中に身体を巡回して働く」「その働きは、自律(交感・副交感)神経のオンとオフの切り替えがうまく行くと高まる」ことを明らかにしています。現代人の暮らしはテレビ、ゲームやスマホなどに交感神経が刺激され、副交感神経の働く時間帯が少なくなっており、睡眠・休養の時間と質が非常に危惧されます。

良い睡眠を確保するためには昼間に適度な活動(運動)を行いましょう。専門医より寒い季節の戸外活動を禁じられている私の場合、TV体操、スロースクワット、一段昇降、縄跳び風ジャンプ、自称メチャクチャ・ダンス(クラシック、ジャズ、歌謡曲、童謡など聴きながら心のままに自由に踊る)を楽しんでいます。
