

For 59 years the JCCC has held Issei Day. This is an opportunity for the JCCC Board of Directors to show their appreciation to all the seniors in our community. It is an event that we look forward to every year.

We are so disappointed but, for 2022, the JCCC has decided to not to hold the event in person. The current wave of covid seems to be highly contagious and we just don't want to chance our community health.

BUT, the JCCC Board of Directors still wants to honour our seniors!

So once again, we are working on getting a FREE bento, to those that are 70 year or older, to enjoy at home. We have set up 5 locations throughout the GTA where you can book a time to pick up your bento. Brothers Mohab and Shady El Nahas represented Canada at the recent Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England, with each brother adding to Canada's medal haul.

Mohab

A 7-time national champion and international competitor in the -90kg category, 26-year-old Mohab El Nahas decided to adjust and is now aiming to climb the national and international rankings to qualify for the 2024 Olympics in the -81kg category. In March, he had a great tournament winning the Prague European Open, but then suffered injury setbacks including a broken finger in May, and rib in July. It was a last-minute decision by Judo Canada and Mohab for him to compete at the Commonwealth Games, and he came through with a stellar performance to win the bronze medal. Social media sites were abuzz with images of some of his spectacular throws enroute to the podium. He had a tough loss in the semi-finals to the eventual gold medal winner from England, but Mohab recovered for a big win in the bronze medal match. An outstanding performance by Mohab as he strives for the top!





Shady

Shady El Nahas put in a workmanlike performance to win gold in the men's -100kg category, as his competition were very defensive against him as the number one seeded competitor at this tournament. At only 24-years of age, Shady adds the Commonwealth Games championship to his resume which already includes 10 national championships, 3 Pan-American championships, 9 medals on the International Judo Federation World Tour (the highest level of competition for judoka), 5th place at Junior and Senior World Championships, and 5th place at the Tokyo Olympics. Currently ranked #4 in the World in the Men's -100kg category, next up for Shady is the World Championships in October in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, as he works towards Gold at the 2024 Paris Olympics!

We invite you to experience *Algorithms of Innocence* in its entirety at the JCCC Gallery. The exhibit is available for viewing until October 16, 2022.



We are proud to be part of the Nuit Blanche program during the overnight of October 1, 2022. The theme, "The Space Between Us" focuses on the topic of sites as places of community and connections in hopes of a better future for humanity. This theme is especially apt in light of various crisis faced by communities across Canada and beyond. The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre will be presenting three exhibitions during the Nuit Blanche festival featuring three Japanese Canadian artist and one Japanese Brazilian artist: Maari Sugawara, Annie Sumi, Brian Kobayakawa, and Erica Kaminishi. These exhibits are curated

to revolve around concepts of the exploring Nikkei identities by transnational artists who experience multiple levels of shifting communal memories and identities as well as contingent national identifications. "You have a very proud story to tell." (Judge Albert Wong, 2022)

On the afternoon of July 4, 2022, the Sedai Project at the JCCC had the privilege of inviting Frank Moritsugu for a special interview to highlight his experience serving in the Canadian Armed Force during WWII, a time of great hardship and turbulence for Japanese Canadians. To add to this notable occasion, Judge Albert Wong who has more than 39 years of service in the Canadian Armed Force conducted the interview. While Frank and Judge Wong served during very different times, their experience of serving as a person of visible minority meant that an instant kinship was established. While Frank's story is well known, Judge Wong teased out myriad details including emotional aspects of his experience.



健やかな老後をめざしてその55 - こむら返りが起こった時!

「こむら返りが最近よく起こるようになって心配!夜中にトイレに行こうとしたら起こるの」と、友人Fさんから電話がありました。私もたまに経験することがあります。「こむら返り」とは、ふくらはぎの筋肉(腓腹筋)がけいれんを起こし、強い痛みを生じた状態です。「脚がつる」とよく表現されます。太ももや腹筋などにも同じような症状が起こることもあり、医学的には総称して「有痛性筋けいれん」と呼びます。ほとんどは心配のないものですが、突然に激痛に襲われると不安が大きいですよね!

筋肉は、脳からの信号が脊髄を通って運動神経の末梢に伝わることにより動き始めます。水分不足、電解質のバランス異常、腓腹筋に影響する姿勢などが原因となって、この経路に異常が生じて過剰な筋肉収縮が起こると考えられています。誰もが経験すると言ってもよいくらいに、就寝中や運動中に起こります。高齢者や妊娠中の人では起こりやすくなる、と言われています。

就寝中には、同じ姿勢が続くことにより同じ筋肉のみが緊張し続ける、あるいは、掛け布団の重みで足先が伸ばされた(押された)状態が続いて、ふくらはぎが収縮しっぱなしになることが誘因ではないかと考えられます。また、激しい運動を行うと、神経や筋肉の過敏性が高まり、こむら返りを起こしやすくなります。さらに運動中には脱水が起きやすく、それに伴って電解質バランスが崩れやすくなる点に留意しておきましょう!

Fさんは75歳の女性です。「最近よく起こるようになった」というのがやはり気にかかりますね。夜中とのことなので、充分な睡眠がとれなければ体調にも影響します。肝硬変、腎機能不全、神経が障害される病気、ホルモン

系(甲状腺・副甲状腺)の病気、高・低ナトリウム血症などが関連している場合もあります。また、薬剤が影響する場合もあります。Fさんは、60代後半に高血圧を指摘され、降圧剤を服用しています。「2ヶ月前から種類と服用量が変更になった」とのことですが、降圧薬や利尿薬のなかにはこむら返りに影響するものがあります。「担当医に夜間の状況を伝えて、薬剤をチェックしてもらうように!」とアドバイスしました。私は「高齢者の薬物治療とそのコンプライアンス」に関する研究で医学博士号を取得しました。研究過程において多くのシニアと面談を行い、薬物治療とセルフケアの難しさを改めて実感しました。持病のある人は、薬物治療の内容が変更になった場合はその後の一般状態に注意を払いましょう。これまでとは異なる症状が生じたり、何となく不調に感じることがあれば、その経過を記録し、担当医に持参しましょう。

さて、こむら返りが起こった際は両手でつま先をつかみ、手前にゆっくりと引きます。ふくらはぎの筋肉が伸びる様になるべく膝を伸ばします。しばらくそのままを保ち、ゆっくり元へもどします。痛みが治まるまで繰り返します。予防にはストレッチが効果的です。壁から少し離れて、脚を肩幅に広げて両手を壁に付け、かかとを上げずに両肘をゆっくり曲げていき、ふくらはぎとアキレス腱をしっかり伸ばします。私は、室内でつま先立ち歩行とかかと伸ばし(段差のヘリを使ってふくらはぎを伸ばす)を行って、筋力アップとストレッチに努めています。脚が冷えると起こりやすいので、就寝前の保温にも注意しています。
