## O-Hanami · お花見

O-Hanami (お花見) literally means "flower viewing", however, it commonly refers only to cherry blossom viewing. Because their life is very short, cherry blossom viewing is easy: Simply take time to enjoy the intensity of the many blossoms by looking at a single tree or a group of trees. From a distance, the trees appear as beautiful clouds, while the beauty of single blossoms can be enjoyed from a close distance. Cherry blossoms are a symbolic flower of the spring, a time of renewal, and the fleeting nature of life. Their beauty peaks after around two weeks and the blossoms start to fall.

During cherry blossom season, it is typical to have hanami parties—cherry blossom viewing parties where visitors can sit and enjoy the view of the cherry trees while enjoying a picnic with friends. Hanami parties have been held for thousands of years in Japan.

The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre has more than 60 trees on site, on the east, south and west sides of the building, with more to come this spring. Some of the trees were gifted to us the Sakura Project, an initiative of the Consulate-General of Japan in Toronto. The rest were planted by Shieido in honour of their 150th Anniversary.

Typically, our trees blossom in late April through early May. For 2022, peak viewing season was May 4 to 13. From now until through the end of viewing season, the JCCC Giftshop will have a selection of sakura themed items. If you are coming to the JCCC to for O-Hanami, consider coming into the building to visit NAKAMORI for a light snack, or to see Strength in Sixty Sakura, our 60th Anniversary Art Installation by Elysha Rei.

## While you are here we ask that you respect all posted signs and use proper O-Hanami etiquette:

- Be respectful of these delicate trees. Please do not pull or shake branches. Do not pick blossoms. Do not climb trees or stand on their roots.
- · Please do not leave garbage in the area. Leave the area beautiful for the next visitors to enjoy.
- · Please park only in designated parking spots. Do not stop your vehicle in the laneway or stand in a place that may put you, or others in danger.

## **Musical "Naomi's Tree"**

### by KARAKORO

Performing Arts group, KARAKORO (Osaka, Japan), who gave audiences a great impression with Eisa show at the JCCC back in 2013, 2014, and 2015, will come back to the JCCC for a musical performance this summer.

Based on the picture book "Naomi's Tree" by Joy Kogawa, Yoko Matsui, director of KARAKORO stage adapted it to a musical. The story is about Naomi, a Japanese Canadian girl who lost her mother in the atomic bombing during World War II when Japan and Canada were at war.

It is a fantasy, with everyone except the main character, Naomi, being an insect or an animal. The story is filled with the hope that everyone will remember Naomi and reflect on the beauty of a peaceful world and the tragedy of war.

We are very happy and proud that JCCC in Toronto is the place where Karakoro is going to perform overseas again after a long interval. I am also looking forward to meeting Joy Kogawa, the author of "Naomi's Tree."

KARAKORO is a performing arts group in Osaka Japan and they perform in Japan and internationally. The group has performed three times at the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre in 2013, 2014 and 2015.

## SHIN ULTRAMAN シン・ウルトラマン

"As good as the action scenes may be, the best thing about Shin Ultraman is the way it gives us reasons to care about the characters at the center of the story instead of just the spectacle." – Film Inquiry

Japan's biggest tokusatsu-vs.-kaiju series gets a revival courtesy of Hideaki Anno and Shinji Higuchi, the team behind Shin Godzilla, to bring a new, more modern take on Ultraman. When giant Kaiju start attacking Japan and conventional weapons are ineffective, the government gathers specialists and establishes the "Kaiju Special Countermeasures Office Task Force" led by Kimio Tamura (Hidetoshi Nishijima), Hiroko Asami (Masami Nagasawa), and Shinji Kaminaga (Takumi Saitoh), a man who can transform into a hero the size of a giant: Shin Ultraman!

"Shin Ultraman" is essentially a kid-friendly parable about how surreal and labyrinthine our world seems when contrasted with the child-like simplicity of a mute hero who can grow really tall and shoots lasers from his karate-chopping hands. "Shin Ultraman" is also a superior giant monster movie, replete with colorful reptilian and squid-like monsters" – RogerEbert.com

It has received eight nominations at the 46th Japan Academy Awards, including Picture of the Year and Director of the Year. Great family–friendly fun with a stellar cast.

## **Kyohei Sorita, Solo Piano Concert**

### In the Kobayashi Hall

The Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre is partnering with Bravo Niagara! Festival of the Arts to proudly present the Ontario debut of internationally-acclaimed pianist Kyohei Sorita in celebration of the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre's 60th anniversary.

One of the most sought-after pianists of his generation, Kyohei Sorita is the winner of the Silver Medal at the prestigious 18th International Chopin Piano Competition (2021) in Warsaw. This is the highest prize for a Japanese-born pianist since Mitsuko Uchida's second prize in 1970. In the coming season, invitations will take Mr. Sorita to the Munich Philharmonic Orchestra (originally under Gergiev, now under Payare), to Poland, Australia, and Austria (Tonkünstler Orchestra) and on a tour with the NDR Elbphilharmonie Orchestra under Alan Gilbert.

In 2020 he gave his debuts in Paris and at the Vienna Musikverein to much acclaim. His orchestra collaborations include Deutsches Symphonie-Orchester Berlin, RAI National Symphony Orchestra, Mariinsky Theatre Orchestra, Warsaw National Philharmonic Orchestra, Russian National Orchestra, Tonkünstler-Orchester, NHK Symphony Orchestra, Yomiuri Japan Symphony Orchestra, and Tokyo Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra.

Mr. Sorita is also the founder, producer, and conductor of the Japan National Orchestra.

Once again we would like to express our appreciation for the effort that all Martial Arts participants have been making since we reopened the programs in the Fall of 2022. The Martial Arts Administrative Team receives a lot of feedback from our staff and each individual Martial Arts program both from participants and from the teaching staff. We are always trying to find ways to make the JCCC Martial Arts experience better for all involved.

One area where we received a lot of feedback regarded the 2022 Summer classes. Many of you expressed concerns about paying for classes when you were on holidays or paying for reduced availability of classes. To accommodate these concerns, the JCCC is introducing a new Summer Fee Schedule. This new fee will include the reduction of the price of classes for the months of July and August by 50%.

You will still pay a flat fee for your Series, fees will still need to be paid during the Series registration time and we will not be processing partial Series payments. But everyone will benefit from these reduced fees.

## **Cooking for Active Seniors**





## Strength in Sixty Sakura

The JCCC 60th Anniversary Exhibit Team is pleased to announce that Strength in Sixty Sakura by Elysha Rei has been selected as our 60th Anniversary Art Installation.

Elysha Rei is a Japanese Australian artist that explores narratives of cultural identity, site-specific history and environmental elements through paper cutting and public art. She is currently undertaking a PhD at QUT exploring how Nikkei Australian artists navigate their identity through creative arts practice. Rei has created and exhibited work, curated exhibitions and managed cultural spaces across Australia, Japan, New Zealand, Netherlands, Thailand and the US. She has been an invited artist in residence for Museum of Brisbane, Artspace Mackay, and Barcaldine Arts Council. In 2018, she was the recipient of an Asialink Arts Creative Exchange in Japan. From February to April 2023 Rei will be an artist in residence in Victoria BC, Canada, as part of the Past Wrongs Future Choices global project.

Of her concept, Rei says "In Japan, the Sakura cherry blossom represent resilience and re-birth; a poignant connection to the JCCC's 60th anniversary in 2023." The beautiful installation of 60 hand-cut paper sakura blossoms will be installed at the end of April and will be a featured installation throughout our 60th anniversary.

Elysha Rei will be part of JCCC's visual art programming for Nuit Blanche Toronto in 2023.



## **Coming Soon - Alexa Hatanaka at the JCCC**

Coming up this fall will be an exhibition of the work of Alexa Hatanaka. She will be showing new paper-based work inspired by her time in Japan at Kashiki Seishi, a generations-old washi mill in the famous Tosa Washi region. Alexa will also be working with Taiko drummers and Japanese dancers to create a performance using some of her wearable paper art pieces. Alexa Hatanaka will be part of JCCC's visual art programming for Nuit Blanche Toronto in 2023.





## 健やかな老後をめざしてその61 - 高齢者の不整脈

不整脈とは「心臓の行う律動的な収縮活動(拍動)のタイミングが何らかの原因で乱れた状態」です。高齢者における代表的なものは、期外収縮(脈が飛ぶ)、心房細動(脈が速くなる)と徐脈(脈が遅くなる)です。

異常に気づくためには日頃の状態を知っておくことが大切です。右利きであれば、左手首の付け根の辺り(親指側)に、右手の人さし指、中指、薬指の3本を当てます。少し押さえると脈がわかります。1分間、その回数を数えてみましょう。通常60~100回ほどです。何度か測定すると平均的な回数をつかめます。慣れてくると、強弱(指を持ち上げようとする拍動の力)やリズムの乱れ(消失、不規則など)がわかるようになります。

加齢とともに期外収縮は増えます。脈が消えた(飛んだ)ように感じたことはありませんか?健康な人にも起こることがあり、ほとんどの場合心配はいりません。誘因となる自律神経の乱れ、不規則な生活、過労やストレス、アルコールやカフェインの摂りすぎ、喫煙などに注意し、もし気になる症状があれば受診しましょう。

心房細動の場合、心房の周囲で異常な電気信号が発生し、1分間に400~600回震えます。即いのちに関わることはありません。しかし、心房が細かく震えると血液を十分に送り出せなくなり、心房内の血液がよどんで血栓ができやすくなり、その血栓が脳まで運ばれて脳梗塞が起こるリスクがあります。75歳以上では、高血圧や糖尿病などの要因と相まってリスクは高まります。また、心房細動が長期間続くと心室の収縮力が低下し、血液を全身に十分に送ることができなくなり、心不全の原因ともなります。脈の乱れ、動

悸やめまいなどを自覚しない人も多いので、脈をチェックした時「とても速い 状態」が頻回にあれば、ぜひ受診しましょう!

心房細動と診断されたら、合併症予防のための薬物療法が行われます。脳梗塞の発症リスクが高ければ、血液を固まりにくくする抗凝固薬が処方されます。副作用として出血が起こりやすくなるので、消化管出血や脳出血などに注意します。また、心臓に負担がかからないように抗不整脈(目的:脈の乱れを防ぐ/心拍数を減らす)が処方されます。

薬だけで完全に抑えることができなければ、心房細動の原因となっている 心筋を焼く治療法(カテーテルアプレーション)が行われます。また、バルーン を使った新しい手法もあります。年齢、体力、進行度、本人の希望などを考慮 し、それらの治療を実施するか否かが判断されます。

徐脈とは「心臓を動かす電気信号がうまく伝わらずに、拍動が1分間に50回以下になった状態」です。加齢に伴い、徐脈になる人は増えていきます。すぐに命に関わることはないので、自覚症状がなければ経過観察が基本です。しかし、脳への血流不足でめまいや失神が生じたり、息切れ、倦怠感や足のむくみなどの自覚症状が生じたりして生活に支障があれば、心臓の働きを助ける機器(ペースメーカー)を植え込む手術が行われます。心臓に留置する新しいカプセルタイプが開発され、感染、癒着や生活上の支障が少なくなりました。ただし、現在は携帯電話、電磁調理器、マッサージ器、MRI検査など、多種多様な電磁波機器に囲まれて暮らしています。電磁波による誤作動に要注意です!
