

At our August 12 Nostalgia Night we welcomed special guest City Councillor Jon Burnside. He was here to make an exciting announcement: Garamond Court would be renamed Sakura Way!

In the 1960s our street was home of a number of printing factories including our building which was CCH Printing. Garamond is a printing font so it was an apt name for the street. The signature address is now a major cultural institution surrounded by 100 Sakura trees. This new name is again reflective of the character of street.

The new signs went up a few days later and gradually Canada Post, Google, the TTC and others will catch up with the new street name. In the meantime, the Garamond Court address still works!

Over the next several months, you will see the new address showing up in publications and online. We look forward to welcoming you on your next visit to 6 Sakura Way!

Nostalgia Night Celebrates the JCCC's 60th Anniversary

What an incredible celebration - two hundred and twenty guests, six exhibits to explore, more than 60 volunteers, an incredible buffet, and a very special surprise announcement.

Guests were greeted by James Heron, Chris Hope, and Marty Kobayashi before signing in with our kimono-clad registration volunteers. Many guests took the time to explore exhibits on display throughout the main floor of the JCCC.

Guests wandered the JCCC taking the opportunity to see the new Yuima-Ru: Spirit of Coming Together exhibit in the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre – an addition to the Maru exhibit on the Japanese Diaspora; visited the Art Gallery to view the JCCC's collection of York Wilson's work; explored the JCCC timeline, and checked out a new joint exhibit with York University – Data Driven Story Telling.

This year's Nostalgia Night was different from past years when we saluted organizations and clubs from the JC community. This Nostalgia Night paid tribute to the JCCC's 60 years and focused on remembering the early years at 123 Wynford Drive, our move to 6 Garamond Court, and then looking forward to the future.

Marty Kobayashi was only eight years old when the Centre opened and as the first presenter, he started with a very nostalgic look back on the development of the Centre. He gave a bit of history on its start, the key people who led the way,

the programs, the clubs, the volunteers, and key events like Caravan's Tokyo Pavilion that spotlighted the JCCC in the broader community. Next, Toronto City Councillor Jon Burnside was introduced to bring greetings from the city and to announce the approval to change the name of Garamond Court to Sakura Way. Chris Hope accepted the new Sakura Way street sign, acknowledging that because of the Japanese Consulate's Sakura Tree planting programs in 2004 and 2012 and Shiseido Canada's recent donations of 75 trees in 2022 and 2023, marking their 150th Anniversary, we now are the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre at 6 Sakura Way!

Following this, a sumptuous Japanese Canadian buffet was served. Guests filled their plates with Japanese Canadian "comfort food" and settled down to listen to James Heron talk about the move to our current location and how the community once again rose to the challenge to make 6 Garamond Court their new home. He spoke of all the new programming this facility has allowed us to create - Toronto Japanese Film Festival in Kobayashi Hall, the Moriyama Nikkei Heritage Centre, JCCC Gallery, Tea Room, and Library to name a few. He spoke about the hardship of the pandemic and how, once again, the community rose up to support the Centre with donations and participating in our fundraiser, Keep the Lantern Lit. He reminded us of the Emperor's wish during his visit, asking us to "keep going and support our community".

Chris Hope, the current JCCC President, then spoke about the future – the strategic planning that will take us into the next five years as we continue to raise our profile as a cultural force within the community both globally and online. We have a big task ahead of us to make sure we can sustain a high level of excellence as a cultural centre and as a key resource of information for education and knowledge building.

We were serenaded by the Mixed Chorus Group Asunaro. Led by Harry Kawabe, the chorus entertained us with three lovely songs. To top off the dinner, we enjoyed dessert and door prizes to bring the evening to a close.

Guests were very appreciative of the event and conveyed their thanks as they accepted one last gift, the 50th Anniversary Yearbook and a 60th Anniversary Pin as they left for the evening.

These events are only possible because of the fantastic volunteers and staff who sit on the Nostalgia Night Planning Committee, advise us, do the registration, set up the event, usher people to their seats, cook the buffet dishes, serve our super seniors, look after the technical stuff, and then tidy up like it never happened!!







TJGC Fall Flowers and Bonsai show

EXHIBITION

"Unchanging and changing and changing" is a solo exhibition and live performance by Alexa Kumiko Hatanaka that features wearable paper artworks that are imbued with the life of the performers alongside the histories of craft and place that inform them.

A reflection on well-being and selfhood, the works unite and contrast needs for protective armours and "inverse armours," the latter activated by dance, music and friends to encourage expression and joy. Hatanaka reflects on personal aftershocks from tsunamis, both real and metaphorical. Her work integrates her formative childhood experience in dance at the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre and is steeped with her recent time spent at a fourth generation paper mill in Japan. Her ethereal work collapse time and string together interconnected histories held within the threads, repairs and fibres of her practice: ancestral ties; the lineage of printmaking, inks and natural dyes; personal narratives incorporating past printmaking blocks; and scraps of papers sewn into the next and the next work.

健やかな老後をめざして その66 - ちょっと骨休み

連載を読んで下さっていると、もしかしたら「えい子さんは相当にストイックな健康志向の人ではないかしら?」と思われているかもしれませんね。どちらかと言えば努力するタイプとは思いますが、けっこう手抜きして生活しているのも事実です。

「意思決定した事を継続して実行する」は強みの1つでしょうか。日常生活、趣味、あるいは仕事でも、その姿勢に変わりはありません。ですから、医療職として学んだことをなるべく生活に活かしたいな、と努力しているに過ぎません。食生活の基本を大事に暮らしていますが、たとえば招待された際やパーティーでは何でもありがたくいただきます。「郷に入れば郷に従え」ですね。また、普段は選ば(食べ)ない食材を味わうことのできる機会を楽しみます。日頃の節制へのご褒美です(笑)。

お酒はどんなものでも香りをかぐのが大好きです。飲むよりもまず香りを楽しんでいます。日本酒であれば、その香りでおよその味を予想します。これがけっこう良く当たります。飲食業の人に褒められ、酒ソムリエのコースを受けようかと思ったほどです(大笑)。日頃から薄味・淡味に心がけ、舌をなるべく繊細に保つように努力し、においをかぐ習慣を大事にしていることが活かされているような気がします。あらゆる酒の香りと味を楽しんでいますが、アルコールに弱いことが幸いして、残念ながら少ししか飲めません。Good for me!

今年も食生活の指標となる検査結果に異常はありませんでした。総蛋白、 アルブミン、ミネラル電解質、鉄分、ビタミン類、総コレステロール、善玉HDL と悪玉LDLコレステロール、血糖など、全ては正常範囲でした。

普通に何でも食べていた30代は、特に肉好きや大食家でなかったにもかからず、総コレステロールは異常値に手が届きそうだったのです。そのまま行けば、40代後半には相当の値に上昇したのはまちがいありません。ところが、生活習慣病に注意を払いながら暮らし始めると、徐々に検査値が改善していきました。つまり、意識して生活すれば悪化を防げるのです!

ところで、私の日常生活を狂わす原因となるものがあります。それは"読書"。たまらなく好きなのですね。小学校卒業時に「6年間でもっとも図書館を利用した生徒」という賞をもらったほどだったのに、中高生時代は進学のための勉強に明け暮れ、職業人となってからは専門書や研究雑誌に目を通すことが中心となり……読書時間よりは睡眠時間の確保が必須でした。

"シニアとなった今こそが人生でもっとも充実している"と感じるのは、時間に追われずに好きなことが自由にできるからです。私にとって、それが読書。いったんシリーズ物など読み始めると(食事はしますが)朝から晩まで読みふけってしまいます。ですから、締切のある仕事をやっている期間は封印します。書棚に近づかないようにしています。アルコールや食べ物はコントロールできるのに、読書は止まらなくなります(笑)。

私にとって、何かを成し遂げた後の読書時間が何よりものご褒美。ただし、 読書は創造力や熟考力を養う点ではいいですが、難点は動かないこと!数日 も続けると、私の足腰が弱ります。シニアの場合"骨休みはほどほどに"も大事 ですね。
