

The JCCC Welcomes Incoming ED Jerrold McGrath as James Heron Retires After 24 Years of Distinguished Service!



The JCCC is pleased to announce the appointment of Jerrold McGrath as its incoming Executive Director, effective April 28, 2025. With over 15 years of leadership experience in the arts and culture sector, McGrath is set to guide the JCCC into its next chapter of success, supporting the JCCC's vision of enriching lives globally through the celebration of Japanese Culture and Japanese Canadian heritage.

Born and raised in Ontario, McGrath has a Masters in Professional Studies in Strategic Innovation and Change. He began his career as a relocation trainer in the Japanese automotive industry in Aichi, Japan, which helped to advance him in his lifelong journey as a student of the Japanese language and his passion for Japanese culture. He now lives in Toronto with his wife, Mihoko Maeno-McGrath, an accomplished visual artist who has exhibited in Japan and Canada, including in the JCCC's art gallery, and their daughter, a high school student and enthusiastic student of Japanese language and culture

Regarding his new role McGrath stated "I am truly excited to take on this role and to explore how we can continue to celebrate Japanese Canadian heritage and its critical role in navigating an increasingly uncertain world. The JCCC has a rich history of resilience and creativity, and I look forward to building on that legacy. Together, we will enhance our meaningful programming to further highlight the Nikkei diaspora and address contemporary issues that resonate with our community."

Chris Hope, President and Board Chair of the JCCC, notes, "We are thrilled to welcome Jerrold to the JCCC team. His vision and experience will be instrumental in advancing the JCCC's mission of promoting the continual building of friendship through culture and the preservation and sharing of the history and great legacy of our ancestors in the Japanese Canadian community."

Current JCCC Executive Director James Heron is officially retiring, and moving to a consultancy role for the JCCC. Adds Hope, "James has generously offered to continue to help out at the JCCC to ensure that the special projects that he created and has fueled with his exemplary passion and expertise over the years will continue to be a success. That naturally includes the Toronto Japanese Film Festival and the ongoing JCCC film program. We look forward to the benefits of James's wisdom and his cheerful presence at JCCC events for many, many years to come."

Please join us in welcoming Jerrold and in celebrating James's official retirement after 24 incredible years at the helm!

JCCCは、新たな館長として、Jerrold McGrathが2025年4月28日付で就任することを発表いたします。 McGrathは、芸術文化分野における15年以上のリーダーシップ経験があり、JCCCの次なる成功の章を切り開く存在として、JCCCのビジョンである, 【enriching lives globally through the celebration of Japanese Culture and Japanese Canadian heritage】の実現に大きく貢献してくれることでしょう。

オンタリオ州で生まれ育ったMcGrathは、戦略的イノベーションと変革に関するプロフェッショナル・スタディーズの修士号を取得。キャリアのスタートは、日本の愛知県における自動車業界でのリロケーション・トレーナーとしてであり、これをきっかけに日本語学習と日本文化への情熱を深めていきました。現在はトロント在住。妻であるMihoko Maeno-McGrathさんは日本とカナダ、そしてJCCCのギャラリーでも展示経験のあるアーティストであり、お二人の娘さんは高校生でありながら、日本語と日本文化を熱心に学ぶ学生です。

新たな役職についてMcGrathは、次のようにコメントしています。「この新たな役割を担うことに、心からワクワクしています。これから、日系カナダ人の歴史や文化を、どうすればもっと多くの人と分かち合えるかを考えていきたいと思います。JCCCは、困難を乗り越えながらも、新しいアイデアで発展してきたすばらしい歴史があります。その流れを受け継ぎながら、さらに良い活動を作っていきたいです。みなさんと力を合わせて、日系コミュニティの広がりを伝えるとともに、今の社会の大切なテーマにも取り組んでいきたいです。」

JCCC会長であり理事長のChris Hopeは次のように述べています。「JerroldをJCCCチームに迎えることができ、とても嬉しく思っています。そのビジョンと経験は、JCCCのミッションである 【文化がわかる。心がかよう。】、そして日系カナダ人の歴史や祖先のすばらしい遺産を守り、伝えていくことをさらに前進させる上で、非常に重要な役割を果たしてくれると確信しています。」

なお、現在のJCCCエグゼクティブ・ディレクターであるJames Heronは正式に退任し、今後はJCCCのコンサルタントとして引き 続き関わっていく予定です。Chris Hope は次のようにも付け加えています。「Jamesは、長年にわたり情熱と専門性を注いできた 特別なプロジェクトを今後も引き継ぎ、成功へと導くため、引き続きJCCCに協力してくださることになりました。それには、トロン ト日本映画祭や、継続中のJCCC映画プログラムも含まれます。これからもJamesの知識と明るい人柄が、JCCCのイベントで多くの 方々を魅了し続けることを楽しみにしています。」



He spends his days tending to his house and garden and enjoying visits from former students, especially Yasuko, for whom he cooks elaborate meals. 壮大な時代劇からじんわり沁みるヒューマンストーリーまで、今年も JCCC日本映画祭の季節がやってきました。ライブラリーでは、映画祭 上映作の原作を多く取り揃えています。読んでから観ても、観てから読 んでも、味わい深い物語の数々。映画の楽しみが2倍に広がる、おすす めの本をご紹介します。

1)室町無頼(上・下) 垣根涼介(新潮文庫)

時は室町中期、応仁の乱前夜。大飢饉と疫病が都を襲う。生き延びた 天涯孤独の少年・才蔵は市中警護役に武術の才を見出され、やがて 蓮田兵衛に預けられることに。兵衛は己の腕と才覚だけで混沌の世を 泳ぐ自由人。その教えと凄絶な棒術修業の果てに、才蔵は生きる力を 身に着けていく。そしてついに、命をかけた蜂起の日がやって来る――。

2) 花まんま 朱川湊人(文春文庫)

昭和30~40年代の大阪下町を舞台に、ノスタルジックな思い出を紡ぐ短篇集。表題作「花まんま」は、早くに両親を亡くした兄妹の物語。「どんなことがあっても妹を守る」という父との約束を守り続けた兄の俊樹は、妹・フミ子の結婚が決まり一息つくも、フミ子は封印していたある重大な秘密を思い出してしまう。第133回直木賞受賞。

3)八犬伝(上・下) 山田風太郎(角川文庫)

江戸の人気作家・滝沢馬琴は、友人で絵師の葛飾北斎に構想中の物語を語り始める。宿縁に導かれた八人の犬士が悪と戦う「南総里見八犬伝」だ。北斎も魅了した同作は人気を集め、異例の長期連載となるが、28年の歳月のうちには息子の死や自身の失明など数多の困難が馬琴を襲う。物語の「虚の世界」と執筆への執念を燃やす馬琴の「実の世界」、二つを緻密に交錯させた傑作。

The Library has lots of titles that have been made into movies!

Here are some books that will double your enjoyment of the films shown at TorontoJFF this year.

(1) Muromachi Muyori (First and Second) Ryosuke Kakine (Shincho Bunko)

The time is the middle of Muromachi, on the eve of the Onin War. A great famine and plague hit the capital. Saizo, a boy who survived the famine and the plague, is discovered by the city guard to have a talent for martial arts, and is eventually entrusted to Hasuda Hyoue. He is a free man who swims in a world of chaos with only his skill and talent. Through his teachings and fierce training in the art of stick fighting, Saizo learns to have the strength to live. Finally, the day of the uprising comes.

(2) Hanamanma by Minato Aikawa (Bunshun Bunko)

A collection of short stories spinning nostalgic memories set in downtown Osaka in the Showa 30s and 40s. The title story "Hana-manma" is about a brother and sister who lost their parents early. Toshiki has kept his promise to his father to protect his younger sister no matter what, but when Fumiko's marriage is finalized, he takes a breather. Winner of the 133rd Naoki Prize.

(3) Hakkenden (First and Second) Futaro Yamada (Kadokawa Bunko)

Takizawa Bakin, a popular Edo writer, begins to tell hisfriend and painter, Katsushika Hokusai, a story he is conceiving. The story is "Nanso Satomi Hakkenden," in which eight dogmen, guided by a destiny, fight against evil. The story, which fascinated Hokusai as well, became so popular that it was serialized for an unusually long period of time, but over the course of 28 years, Bakin faced numerous difficulties, including the death of his son and the loss of his own sight. This is a masterpiece that closely interweaves the "imaginary world" of the story with the "real world" of Bakin's obsessive devotion to writing.

Sedai Corner

Back in March, we proudly announced the launch of the Japanese Canadian Legacies Society Sedai Grant—and we're thrilled to share that this grant is helping us take Sedai to the next level!

Over the next two years, this space will be your go-to hub for updates on all things Sedai: from preservation efforts to community outreach, film projects, and more. Here's a look at what we've been up to so far:

Preservation

We're laying the groundwork to ensure the stories we've gathered through Sedai are preserved for generations to come. Claire has been hard at work digitizing our earliest interview tapes—carefully auditing, packaging, and sending them off to trusted digitization experts in the community.

At the same time, we're upgrading our digital and physical storage systems to make sure your stories are kept safe and accessible. Another important step? Making more interviews available to the public. Our Heritage team will be connecting with past interviewees and their families to finalize permissions so we can share these stories far and wide. We also have a team of dedicated transcriptionists working on getting interviews transcribed so they can be easily accessed!



Outreach

One of the pillars of Sedai is community connection. Karen is leading the way by developing Oral History Workshop curricula, tailored for both individuals and community organizations. After a pilot session this June, she'll be rolling out workshops across the community, providing resources and support for those interested in conducting their own oral histories. Stay tuned—your chance to join one might be just around the corner!

Activation & Expansion

This is where things get really exciting! Our winter intern, Lenora, collaborated with local artist Hitoshi Murakami to create a powerful video about Sedai. This video will premiere at the Toronto Japanese Film Festival, opening a spotlight on our stories in a brand-new way.

And there's more—we're also opening the door for community members to donate their own interview footage. Starting June 1, you'll be able to fill out a submission form on our website and contribute to the growing Sedai archive.

To keep up with everything happening in Sedai, we've added a dedicated <u>Sedai Outreach</u> page on the JCCC website. This is where you'll find the latest updates, ways to get involved, and upcoming events.

We're just getting started—and we can't wait to grow, learn, and share this journey with you. Let's keep the legacy alive, together.

Third Places is Now Open!

Join the JCCC Heritage Department in celebrating the launch of our newest temporary exhibit, Third Places: Japanese Canadian Sites of Gathering!

Third Places are places that aren't home and aren't work, where people gather and find community.

For Japanese Canadians of all generations, creating third places in Toronto has been a powerful way to make space after being displaced. The exhibit considers the importance of such places for Japanese Canadians over the past 70 years and the future of Japanese Canadian community spaces.



Featuring a large, hand-illustrated map, interactive panels, and audiovisual components, Third Places shares stories of 12 significant Japanese Canadian places in Toronto. The exhibit reflects the diversity of the community and calls on visitors to think about their own experience of place and community.

Phase in My Journey Photography Exhibit



「おならがよく出るし、下痢になりやすい」「おなかが張ってガスがたまる」「おなかの調子が悪くて便秘ぎみ」「便を出し切れない感覚が残って不快」「いぼ痔や切れ痔がある」

上記にあげた排便トラブルを経験したことがあるのではないでしょうか?食べてから排泄するまでの過程ですが、まず食べた物は胃で消化され、小腸に運ばれて栄養が吸収されます。残ったカスは大腸の蠕動(ぜんどう)運動によってゆっくりと運ばれ、その間に水分が吸収されて適度な柔らかさの便が作られます。そして、一定量たまると直腸に送られます。

トラブルの中でも「便秘」に悩んでいる人が多いですね!便秘のタイプは大きく分けて「排便回数が少ない(週3回未満)」「排便自体が困難である」の2つ。前者はストレスなどの影響で便が直腸にうまく送られない、あるいは、食事量が少ないために便の量も少なくなることが原因です。便が大腸に長くとどまると水分が吸収されすぎるので、小さく固い便が特徴です。しかし、回数が少なくてもスムーズに排便できているのであれば特に問題はありません。後者は、加齢により排便に関わる筋力の低下や直腸の変化(直腸壁が膨らんだ状態)が起こり、強くりきんでも出にくく、便の残った感じが生じます。強くりきむと血圧が上がり、脳卒中や心筋梗塞のリスクが高まります。また、前者と後者は互いに関連し合いながら悪循環へとつながることもあるので、やはり便秘を放置してはいけません。

対策の基本は何と言っても食生活!十分な食事量の確保にはきちんと3食を。腸がもっとも活発に動くのは朝なので、特に朝食が大事です。また、腸内環境を整えることも大切。発酵食品(ヨーグルト、納豆、みそ、キムチなど)、善玉菌を増やすオリゴ糖(玉ねぎ、乳製品、バナナ、はちみつ、納豆など)、食物繊維の豊富な物(玄米などの雑穀、アボカド、じゃがいも、ごぼう、納豆、なめこ、キウイ、葉もの野菜、海藻など)を意

識的に摂りましょう。高齢になるとどうしても水分摂取が少なくなります。 医師による制限がなければ「食事以外に1.5~2.0リットル」が目安です。排便習慣も大事!「決まった時間にトイレに行く」「我慢しない」を心がけましょう。我慢を繰り返すと便意を感じにくくなります。決まったトイレ時間をいつにするか……暮らし方を考えてみましょう。 私の場合、朝食後60分頃に便意を感じます。上記にあげた食事内容と水分に気をつけるようになって以降、便秘に陥ることがほとんどありません。生活習慣の大切さが叫ばれていなかった若い頃、健康意識が十分でなかった……今さらながら気づきます。反省点です。

便秘を招かないためには運動も大事!活動が低下すると腸の働きも弱まり、全身の筋力を維持することが難しくなって便秘に陥りやすくなります。有酸素運動(ウォーキング、ダンス、ジョギング、水泳など)は腸の動きを活発にします。もちろん、家事や買い物の際に階段を使う、遠回りして歩くなど、日常生活で運動量を増やすことがもっとも簡便で継続につながりますね。私は60代までは「要領よく作業をこなす」を心がけていましたが、74歳の今は「一度にこなさず何度かに分ける(家の中を往復)」ように努めています。「台所から遠い寝室にきた際にはこれとあれを整理」ではなく「歩いて行く機会を増やす」ために作業を残します。認知機能の低下ではなく、あえて忘れるように(笑)。

様々な事柄を試みても改善しないために市販薬に頼っている人はけっこう多いかもしれません。しかし、便秘のタイプによって使用する薬は異なります。長期の市販薬使用による問題も生じます。かかりつけ医に相談することを勧めます。

Bon Odori 2025


