A Message from Executive Director, Jerrold McGrath



On September 12, 2025, most of the staff and board members of the JCCC will be heading to Stratford to see *Forgiveness*, adapted by Hiro Kanagawa from Mark Sakamoto's memoir *Forgiveness: A Gift from My Grandparents*. We will climb onto a bus together and make the trip as a team. We don't often have this opportunity to leave our usual routines behind and to go somewhere together to experience a story. Our staff and board span different generations, come from different places, and carry different connections to Japanese Canadian culture. Some of us have family stories that touch directly on the events the play describes. Others arrived after and are learning from those that came before. Some have come to this work through friendship, study, or a deep curiosity about Japanese culture and history.

For me, this trip is about making space to listen and reflect together. The internment is not history. It is something that continues to shape lives and relationships, often in ways that are quiet but persistent. Sitting side by side in a theatre, sharing the silences, and the laughter, and then carrying the conversation back onto the bus for the ride home is part of how we learn to be a community that can hold many difficult,

and sometimes contradictory, truths at once.

In Japan, the tradition of tsukimi, or moon-viewing, invites us each autumn to gather in shared stillness and recognition under a beautiful, brief light. The custom dates back to Heian-period court rituals of poetry-writing under the full moon and has grown, over centuries, into gatherings where families and friends offer rice dumplings (tsukimi dango), pampas grass (susuki), and seasonal harvest foods to honor the planet and one another. This year, the main tsukimi, known as chūshū no meigetsu (the mid-autumn moon), falls on October 6, when the moon will be at its roundest and brightest. The beauty of tsukimi is that it is as much about who you are with as what you are looking at. The moon's light is the same for everyone, but each person sees it through the lens of their own life.

In a way, our trip to Stratford is our own tsukimi. We are introducing an intentional pause in the middle of our busy work to notice something important, to see it clearly, and to share what we see with others. We'll return to the JCCC changed in small ways by what we've witnessed, and those changes will ripple into how we welcome people, tell our stories, and imagine the future.

2025年9月12日、JCCCの多くのスタッフと理事たちは、ストラトフォードへと向かい、マーク・サカモト氏の回想 Forgiveness: A Gift from My Grandparents を原作に、ヒロ・カナガワ氏が舞台化した作品 Forgiveness を鑑賞します。私たちはバスに乗り込み、チームとして一緒に旅に出ます。日々の慌ただしさから離れ、みんなでどこかへ出かけて、一つの物語を共有する機会はそう多くはありません。

私たちのスタッフや理事には、世代も出身もさまざまで、日本文化や日系カナダ人としてのつながり方も人それぞれです。この舞台が描く出来事に家族の歴史として深く関わっている人もいれば、後からこの文化に出会い、先人たちから学んでいる人もいます。また、友情や学びを通して、あるいは日本文化や歴史への関心から、JCCCに関わるようになった人もいます。

私にとってこの旅は、共に耳を傾け、共に振り返るための時間です。強制収容の歴史は、過去の出来事として片づけられるものではなく、今もなお、静かに、けれど確かに、人々の暮らしや人間関係に影響を与え続けています。 劇場で隣り合って座り、沈黙や笑いを分かち合い、その余韻をバスの中で語り合いながら持ち帰る、そうした体験を通じて、私たちは、時に矛盾し、複雑であっても、異なる考えや感じ方を尊重しながら、ともに歩んでいくための大切な学びを得られるのだと思います。

日本には「月見」という伝統があります。 毎年秋になると、人々は静けさの中に身を置き、束の間の美しい月の光を見上げるために集まります。 この風習は平安時代の貴族たちが満月の下で詩を詠んだ宮中行事に始まり、やがて月見団子やススキ、秋の収穫物を供え、月や互いを敬う集いへと発展していきました。今年の中秋の名月(ちゅうしゅうのめいげつ)は10月6日で、この日、月は一年で最も丸く、明るく輝くとされています。

月見の美しさは、「何を見るか」だけでなく、「誰と見るか」にあるのだと思います。 同じ月の光を浴びていても、その人の歩んで きた人生によって、月の見え方や感じ方は少しずつ異なるものです。

ある意味で、今回のストラトフォードへの旅は、私たちにとっての「月見」のようなものかもしれません。忙しい日常の中に、意識的にひとときの「間(ま)」をつくり、大切なものに目を向け、それを他者と分かち合う時間です。 舞台で見たことを通して、私たちは少しずつ何かが変わった自分を連れてJCCCに戻ってくることでしょう。 そしてその変化は、私たちの人の迎え方、物語の語り方、未来の描き方に、静かに波紋を広げていくのだと思います。 SEPTEMBER 2025 FALL PROGRAMMING

Autumn at the JCCC: A Season of Film, Music, Art, and Community

As summer fades into the deep colours and cool air of autumn, the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre is preparing a season of events that invite you to connect, reflect, and celebrate together. Whether you join us for an intimate film screening, a day on the golf course, or an evening of music, there's something for everyone in our fall line-up.

September 11 - Onde as Ondas Quebram (Where the Waves Break)

Our fall film season begins with this moving exploration of identity, migration, and the ties that bind us to the sea and to each other. Shot with breathtaking cinematography, the film invites audiences into the rhythms and hardships of coastal life, asking what it means to belong in an ever-changing world.

September 14 - 27th Annual Family & Friends Golf Tournament

A JCCC tradition for over a quarter century, this tournament blends friendly competition with the warmth of community gathering. From the first tee to the final hole, it's a day of camaraderie, good food, and shared memories on the greens.

September 18 - See Her, Be Her

The documentary follows the lives of seven women baseball stars from around the globe, showcasing their dedication and competition in the Women's Baseball World Cup including Japan's Ayami Sato, star pitcher of the Toronto Maple Leafs professional men's team. A celebration of resilience, creativity, and self-determination, the screening offers a space for reflection on how representation shapes the possibilities for the next generation.

October 4–5 – Nuit Blanche with Louise Noguchi: The Shape of Loss

Renowned Japanese Canadian artist Louise Noguchi's The Shape of Loss "translates" the intangible losses of Japanese Canadian livelihood, property, and dignity during WWII into life-sized drawings of confiscated fishing boats, created in a co-produced performance during Nuit Blanche from October 4 at 7 pm to October 5 at 7 am. Working with collaborators and descendants of the original boat owners, Noguchi will draw the hulls of the 1,137 Nikkei fishing boats seized after Pearl Harbor while their histories are read aloud. The resulting drawings and a time-lapse video will remain on view in the JCCC Gallery until January 18, 2026. An artist talk with Noguchi will take place on November 20 at 7 pm.

October 5 - Issei Day

A cherished annual gathering honouring the Japanese Canadian pioneers who built the foundations of our community. This day features performances, food, and shared stories that connect generations and remind us of the resilience that sustains our culture.

October 9 - Unreachable

In a dreamlike Tokyo tale, three young women (Suzu Hirose, Hana Sugisaki, Kaya Kiyohara) bound by a mysterious 12-year secret face the unraveling of their makeshift sisterhood when unrequited love threatens their fragile harmony, in Yuji Sakamoto's delicately crafted and emotionally resonant drama.

November 12 – Kyohei Sorita in Concert

Internationally acclaimed pianist Kyohei Sorita returns to Toronto for an evening of breathtaking artistry. Known for his expressive interpretations and technical brilliance, Sorita's performance promises an unforgettable night for classical music lovers. Tickets are on sale now!

December 6 - Keep the Lantern Lit

Our year-end fundraising event returns for 2025, bringing together gourmet food, film, and community spirit to help sustain the JCCC for the year ahead. It's an evening where generosity, friendship, and culture illuminate the long winter nights. Limited edition packages are on sale from September 1.



September Film: Onde as Ondas Quebram (Where the Waves Break)



Portuguese and Japanese with English subtitles

Brazil is home to the largest Nikkei diaspora in the world — sharing similarities with other Japanese diasporas, with key differences. In the essay film "Where the Waves Break", the Japanese Brazilian documentary filmmaker Inara Chayamiti investigates her fragmented identity by gluing together pieces of her family's story and the Japanese Brazilian saga, marked by two diasporas between opposite sides of the world: Brazil and Japan.

In this first feature-length documentary directed by a Japanese-Brazilian woman, she builds generational and cultural bridges from an authentic point of view and a curious and affective quest. And by revisiting the past from erased angles, she tells invisible stories from her community. It is historical and current, personal and universal.



Misaki, Yuka and Sakura (Suzu Hirose, Hana Sugisaki, Kaya Kiyohara) live together in a rambling old house in a corner of Tokyo. They have the rapport of siblings:

Sakamoto's script delivers a "big reveal" in its opening 30 minutes that would be the closing note in most other films, then goes on to explore the implications of their situation. It is a delicate, dreamlike fantasy built around luminous performances from three of Japanese top young actresses (Suzu Hirose, Hana Sugisaki, Kaya Kiyohara) with Ryusei Yokohama (Kokuho, Faceless) thrown in to the beguiling mix.

Classes & Courses Registration

The JCCC Programs Team is working on registration processes to make it easier for our members and new participants.

The JCCC has updated the registration process for Cultural, Recreational and Martial Arts classes and courses.

- 1. Registration will open a minimum of 4 weeks prior to the first class.
- 2. Priority Registration will be offered to currently enrolled participants for the first 2 weeks of a registration period
- 3. General Registration will be opened to all participants, including new participants, after Priority Registration.
- 4. Registration will close 1 week after the first class or when all spaces are filled.

Currently enrolled participants will still be able to register during General Registration and right up until Registration closes. However, currently enrolled participants will no longer have priority space in the program and registrations will be processed on a "first come-first serve" basis after the priority period ends.

Registrants are encouraged to use the <u>JCCC Portal</u> for all registrations. The JCCC Reception Desk and the Programs Team are available to assist participants with any registration challenges and can be reached by visiting in-person, calling 416-441-2345, or by sending an email to registration@jccc.on.ca for any martial art, cultural or recreational class registration.



The Japanese Language will not be included in the transition to the JCCC Registration Portal for the Fall Term 2025 and will continue to follow the same process as in the Spring Term. However the priority and general registration periods will still apply to Japanese Language enrollments.

Renowned Japanese Canadian artist Louise Noguchi's *The Shape of Loss* 'translates' intangible losses of Japanese Canadian livelihood, property, and dignity during WWII into tangible, life-sized drawings of confiscated fishing boats through a co-created, live performance during the all-night Nuit Blanche festival on October 4, beginning at 7pm.



Out of public and political pressure fueled by racism and suspicion that Nikkei fishermen might be a threat to national security, the Canadian government began impounding their fishing boats the day after the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7, 1941. Fishermen from across BC were ordered to deliver their boats to a designated port, where they were immobilized and later towed to Steveston. In total, 1,137 Nikkei boats were impounded.

During Nuit Blanche night, Noguchi, in collaboration with other artists, will create a visual representation of the physical magnitude of the fishing boat loss.

Throughout the evening, the artists will create life-sized line drawings of the 1,137 Nikkei fishing boats (hulls only). As the hulls, measuring from 25 feet to 68 feet in length are drawn, descendants of boat owners will read aloud the owner's name and boat information.

Louise Noguchi is a Toronto-based artist whose work has been exhibited nationally and internationally, including at the Embassy of Canada Prince Takamado Gallery, Tokyo and most recently at the Art Gallery of Ontario, Toronto.

The drawn hulls and a time-lapse video of the performance will remain in the gallery until the show closes on January 23, 2026.

An artist talk will take place on November 20 at 7:00pm at the JCCC!



健やかな老後をめざして その86

~ シニアの夢! ~

人はいつ自身の老いを自覚し始めるのでしょうか?

20代後半の頃、リレー徒競走に出場しました。全速力で走っていた時、気持ちが焦って両脚がからまり、転倒しそうになりました。「え〜、いったいどうしたの!」と思った瞬間を鮮明に覚えています。私にとってあの瞬間が(身体の)老いを感じた最初かもしれません。次に30代半ばのある日、耳の横に1本のグレイへアを見つけました。その当時、美しい黒髪を保っていた66歳の母は「染めているの?」と尋ねられることもしょっちゅう! それもあって「グレイへアはずっ〜と先のこと」と勝手に思っていた私……ショックでした。これも老いを強く実感した出来事です。

30代後半から50歳にかけては、大学院へ進学・アメリカへ留学・看護学士&大学院課程の創設に心血を注ぐ日々が続き、心身の老いなど感じている暇がありませんでした。「更年期はいつ?」と思い返してもわからないくらいです。とは言っても、否が応でも生物としての老化は迫ってきます。50代後半には母の介護による体調不良(逆流性食道炎と血圧変動)、視力の低下と老眼、膝と股関節の痛みを経験しました。74歳の今、それらが進行していない、あるいは回復しているのは、これまでお伝えしてきた諸々の対策(健康行動)のお陰でしょうか。特に、毎日の「水素水&食生活」と「ちょこっと運動」の効果と考えています。日々の継続こそが何よりも大切、と実感しています。

しかし、それらの努力も老いのスピードには敵わない日がやってきます。現に、カナダ移住がきっかけで生じた環境への適応障害(血液自己免疫疾患:低気温により赤血球破壊)は年齢と共に進行し、テキスト通りに様々な症状が臓器に生じています。感染症罹患(インフルエンザ、新型コ

ロナなど)による急激な悪化を現実的に経験し「人々と接して生きる暮らしが私の生命を脅かす」ことを覚悟せざるをえません。

シニアの皆さま、あなたも「抱える健康問題とどう付き合っていけばよいか」と思案し、悩み、苦しみ、対処しながら、毎日を暮らしているのではないでしょうか。私は、どのような状況下にあっても「今を生きる」ことに感謝し「夢(希望)を燃やし続けたい」と思っています。年齢と共に失われていくことが多くなるのは必然。それならば「まだ残されている力をどう使い切るか」と考える・挑戦するほうが、明日を生きるための糧になるのではないでしょうか。

私は生きることに欲張りなので、健康問題と付き合う日々の中でもついつい楽しいことに目を向けます。この年になると、楽しいと思えないことは切り捨てます。案外と若者にはできない、シニアの良さかもしれませんね。こどもが、親が、同僚が、上司が、親せきが……などにはもう縛られない自由さがあります。

長い間、医療職として教育や研究に携わってきました。ところが、54歳の時に日系文化会館(トロント)で開催されたトロント紅白歌合戦に出演し、様々な舞台を経験するうちに「子供の頃から舞台で歌い、踊ることが好きだった!」と気づきました。この気づきに導かれて68歳でプロ歌手デビュー(東京)。コロナ禍で中止となっていたリサイタルを2025年10月にふるさと大分で主催します。遅咲き歌手EIKOをどうぞ応援してください。

夢(希望)をもつことは、シニアになればなるほど生きる力(いきがい)につながります。身体は確実に老いていきます。でも、人としての老いは魂が萎えたときではないでしょうか。大きくても小さくても、その夢を大事に歩いていきたいものです。いつか皆さまの夢をお聴かせくださいね。
