Many in our community are familiar with this individual through his past involvement in arts and cultural initiatives, including projects and events supported by the Japanese Canadian Cultural Centre.

The JCCC Board and management are closely monitoring the situation. At this time, we do not believe there is any impact on current programming or operations.

We understand that this news may be difficult for those who have worked with this individual, or who feel personally affected.

Our thoughts are with anyone who may be impacted by these allegations. We encourage anyone who needs support to reach out to available mental health, law enforcement and community resources for assistance.

While these reports are deeply troubling, we ask all members to avoid speculation, and to allow the legal process to proceed with fairness.
